

- Conducting research and publishing evidence-supported articles, books, and curricula for educators and parents
- Creating community partnerships and seeking outside funding to support the talent development of gifted and academically advanced students from low-income and traditionally underrepresented backgrounds

ACADEMIC YEAR OPTIONS ON CAMPUS



Saturday Academy at Vanderbilt for the Young (SAVY) - Grades K-6

SAVY provides a dynamic, fast-paced curriculum experience to qualifying gifted and academically advanced children in grades K–6. Vanderbilt faculty or graduate students, content experts, and master teachers trained in gifted education implement an accelerated curriculum. SAVY meets for three to six consecutive Saturdays each fall and spring. During a session, students dive into a specific area of interest. Students may enroll in the fall session, spring session, or both.



Weekend Academy at Vanderbilt University (WAVU) – Grades 7-12.

WAVU is an intensive, Saturday program that provides academically advanced middle and high students with an in-depth look at contemporary careers in math, science, engineering, o the humanities. Held for one full Saturday each fall and spring, WAVU incorporates accelerated laboratory courses led by professionals in their field and an opportunity for in-depth career exploration along with support and resources for families.





Summer Academy at Vanderbilt for the Young - A Rising 1st - 6th Grade Day Experience

Summer SAVY offers academically advanced students in rising first through

sixth grades a fast-paced, accelerated curriculum taught by content experts and knowledgeable educators. SAVY is a weekday program in which students can select from a variety of courses. Students sign up for one SAVY class per session to explore a topic in depth. There are six one-week options on Vanderbilt campus. Students may enroll in multiple sessions.

Vanderbilt Summer Academy -A Rising 8th - 12th Grade Residential Experience

VSA is specifically designed for advanced students in rising 7th-12th grade. The

youngest VSA students stay on campus a week, 9th and 10th graders spend two weeks on campus, and 11th and 12th grade students are fully immersed in content during a three week session! Students in VSA experience life on a college campus as they live in a residence hall, eat in the dining hall, and connect with intellectual peers. Students engage in accelerated course work taught by Vanderbilt faculty and scholars while living in a vibrant social community with their classmates.

MENTOR IMMERSION



PTY's Mentor Immersion program is a unique experience offering in-depth exposure in an IMMERSION academic field . As part of the experience students engage in accelerated content in a discipline and work toward creating an independent research product or project in their selected field of study with the support of a content expert with whom

they are paired. There is a maximum of 8 students paired with a mentor and an additional teaching assistant/peer guide. Through this experience students are able to deepen their understanding in a field of study while making new friends with like-ability peers and conducting research or creating a project similar to practicing professionals.

The Mentor Immersion program during the academic year runs for 6 months and is designed for 10th through 12th grade students. The 6-month time frame in the academic year allows for the same number of contact hours as the 3-month Mentor Immersion experience offered during the summer session.

PTY also offers younger students an opportunity for mentorship through Rising Experts: Mini Mentor Immersion. This program is a one-month summer experience designed specifically for rising 9th and 10th grade students Rising Experts offer students early exposure to the content of a field, related career path information, and the opportunity to complete a small project associated with the field. This project provides an introduction to the work associated with the interest area.

PTY ONLINE ACADEMY

PTY Online Academy is an online learning opportunity that offers synchronous experiences for the academically advanced students. The program has opportunities for 3rd through 12th graders. Students enroll in a class that meets live an online. Outside of class students complete asynchronous assignments and meet during office hours with their instructor and teaching assistant for additional help. PTY Online Academy offers a variety of course and meeting times options to fit different schedules.



A FEW FACTS ABOUT OUR STUDENT PROGRAMS

Each year we see over 1000 students attend one or more of our programs. During a typical residential program year, at least thirty

states and ten countries other than the U.S. are represented through our students and staff.

Supporting Educators

Throughout the year PTY's Gifted Education Institute offers professional development opportunities on a variety of topics for practicing professionals. Educators and school district representatives may choose to attend any of the three annual conferences on Vanderbilt's campus. PTY's fall conference focuses on meeting the needs of high-ability, low-income students and



students from underrepresented populations. The spring conference focuses on effective curriculum and instructional strategies for high-ability learners. One day training opportunities on specific topics are also offered throughout the year, generally led by PTY faculty or other nationally-know experts. In addition, GEI offers an intensive summer experience designed to meet the State of Tennessee's standards for employment as a gifted education teacher.

Supporting Parents

Programs for Talented Youth is dedicated to aiding parents and families of gifted students as they foster the talents and abilities of their children. PTY offers parent support groups that meet on select Saturdays in the fall and spring. These groups are designed to help parents better understand and address the unique social, emotional, and cognitive needs of advanced students.

Research and Resource Development

PTY faculty and staff conduct research and publish articles, books, and book chapters on a variety of topics in gifted education. PTY faculty and staff also seek partnerships, gifts, and grant funding to develop products, lead research initiatives, and support gifted students including those who are from low-income backgrounds or who are historically underrepresented in gifted programs.
