Forty-two students have been selected to receive the Nichols Humanitarian Fund Award to pursue humanitarian projects during the summer of 2017.

The award will enable students to work with communities on humanitarian efforts including human rights, public health, immigrant rights, early childhood education, and environmental sustainability. The average GPA of the student recipients is 3.46, and the countries where they will work include Ecuador, England, Greece,
Guatemala, Honduras, India, Israel, Morocco, Palestine, Peru, Russia, South Africa, the United States, and Vietnam.

Blackshear, GA | Middle Eastern & South Asian Studies, Comparative Politics | 2017



JULIE JONES


Muskegon, MI | International Development and Social Change, Theatre, Human and Organizational Development | 2018
