THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The undergraduate processional begins as the banner bearer, dean, and Founder's Medalist for each of the four undergraduate schools enter the stadium.

Entering from the rear of the audience are the representatives from the College of Arts and Science, including Dean John Geer. Their banner has a white field.

The representatives from the Blair School of Music, including Dean Lorenzo F. Candelaria, will then enter. Their banner has a pink field.

Blair is followed by the School of Engineering representatives, including Dean Philippe M. Fauchet. Their banner has an orange field.

Representatives from Peabody College, including Dean Camilla Benbow, will then enter. Their banner has a light blue field.

After the banners are placed and the deans have entered, the second part of the academic procession will enter. The order is: Chair of the Faculty Senate Catherine McTamane, carrying the mace

The graduate and professional degree recipients of the Divinity School, the Graduate School, the Law School, the School of Medicine, the School of Nursing, the Owen Graduate School of Management, and Peabody College will celebrate their Commencement in separate ceremonies.

The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak tree is a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity. The stylized oak leaf and acorn in the Vanderbilt logo were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The predominant colors in the Vanderbilt coat of arms are black and gold. The initial "V" has been used frequently throughout the years as an architectural detail on campus buildings. The Vanderbilt University wordmark incorporates two typefaces, graphically linking old and new, our history and our future.

The 2021 chair of the Faculty Senate carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university's authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The chancellor's insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder's Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. The decagonal silver frame of the medallion symbolizes the ten schools.

Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping on the velvet bars of the sleeves. The design

of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor's degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black.

The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—open, pointed sleeves lined with dark blue satin to signify the Ph.D. Vanderbilt's custom gown for those receiving the doctor of philosophy has antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered "V" on the gown's yoke. Vanderbilt doctoral candidates wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D., D.N.P., or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, apricot for nursing, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines. Masters' hoods are edged with white for arts, brown for fine arts, gold for science, purple for law, salmon pink for public health, peacock blue for public policy, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

THE Nichols- Chancellor's MEDAL

The Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is one of the university's highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols. The medal is presented at Vanderbilt University Graduates Day.

The 2021 Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is presented to Dr. Anthony Fauci, the nation's top leader in infectious disease research and an internationally renowned biomedical scientist. Since 1984, he has served as director of the National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases at the National Institutes of Health. He also is chief of the NIAID Laboratory of Immunoregulation, where he has made many contributions in basic and clinical research.

Fauci has advised seven presidents on HIV/AIDS and many other domestic and global health issues. He was one of the principal architects of the President's Emergency Plan for AIDS Relief, which has saved millions of lives throughout the developing world. He became one of America's most recognizable physician-scientists while serving on the White House Coronavirus Task Force. In addition to his leadership of the NIAID, he now is chief medical adviser to the Biden administration and is a member of its COVID-19 response team.

Fauci earned his bachelor's degree from the College of the Holy Cross and his medical degree from Cornell University Medical College. He completed an internship and residency at The New York Hospital-Cornell Medical Center. His awards include the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the National Medal of Science, the George M. Kober Medal of the Association of American Physicians, and the Mary Woodard Lasker Award for Public Service.

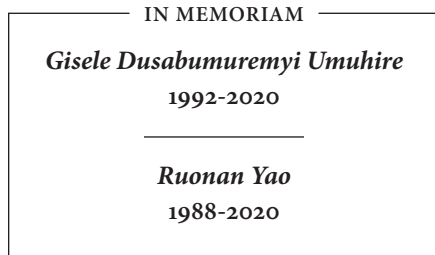

THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

Dominic Cruz Bustillos, from San Rafael, California, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the College of Arts and Science. He is graduating with a bachelor of arts.

Dominic attributes his success to the work ethic instilled by his family. His grandmother, who immigrated from Chihuahua, Mexico, had a particularly strong impact on his appreciation for his opportunities in the U.S. Dominic earned triple honors in the College of Arts and Science, History, and Russian. After a year in St. Petersburg, he wrote two honors theses analyzing the relationship between coal miners, collective action, and authoritarianism in Ukraine's Donbas region. He is the first student at Vanderbilt to write and defend a thesis in Russian. He was an original member of Vanderbilt's Research on Conflict and Collective Action Lab and studied nuclear nonproliferation. He was a research assistant at the Kennan Institute of the Woodrow Wilson International Center for Scholars. He now is a full-time research assistant for retired Lt. Col. Alexander Vindman at the Lawfare Institute. His goal is to work in government or academia to contribute to research on conflict and collective action in Russia and Ukraine.

Kaila Geisinger, from Stuart, Florida, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Blair School of Music. She is graduating with a bachelor of music.

Kaila's diverse experiences have helped shape her future. At Vanderbilt, she majored in harp performance and human and organizational development, with a minor in art. Her oil painting has influenced her marketing skills, her business and physiology classes have influenced the way she approaches strategy, and her work ethic and determination have been strengthened by her dedication to the harp. She was active in Sigma Alpha Iota women's music fraternity and in Vanderbilt Student Government. She won second place in the 2019 American Harp Society National Harp Competition and received the 2020 Theodore Presser Scholarship. She performed as part of Vanderbilt's 2020 Commencement ceremony and always enjoys performing with her sister, a violist. Kaila is staying in Nashville after graduation and is pursuing a marketing role in a startup software company while continuing her harp performances through opportunities in the community.

After graduation, Samantha will work as an associate consultant at Bain & Company in Houston for three years before attending Harvard Law School through their Junior Deferral Program. He remains grateful for the highly competitive Ingram Scholarship that made it possible for him to first come to Vanderbilt to earn his undergraduate degree. At Owen, Kevin chose to focus on health care and finance, building upon his longtime interest in improving the health care system in the United States. He was influenced by the devastating toll that Alzheimer's disease had on two of his grandparents and its impact on family caregivers. At Owen he especially enjoyed an independent study under Professors Craig Lewis and Michael Stuart to assess the efficacy of firms' communication methods by their investor relations departments. Kevin earned a 3.979 GPA while devoting time to the Owen Career Management Center as a recruiter host and peer mentor. His passion for simplifying health care and identifying lower-cost alternatives for consumers led him to intern in Cigna's Financial Development Program last summer, and he is delighted to be returning to the company in Chicago after graduation.
