Aboard the New Expedition Cruise Ship DIANA



Dear Alumni and Friends,

The history of the southern and western shores of the Mediterranean can be told from many perspectives. To an ancient historian, it is the story of early Phoenician expansion westward, followed by Roman conquests, and ending with the Punic Wars and the destruction of Carthage in the 2nd century BC. For a medievalist, the story begins with the stunningly rapid spread of Islam across North Africa and onto the Iberian Peninsula in the 6th-8th centuries and ends with the Spanish reconquest of Granada in 1492.

During this voyage, we will touch on chapters of each of these stories, as we call in ports along North Africa and in Spain and Portugal. In Tunisia, we visit the ruins of Carthage and marvel at the stunning Roman mosaics in the Bardo Museum. Tipasa's ancient temples and ruins are our first call in Algeria, followed by the UNESCO-designated Roman ruins at Djémila. Further west along the North African coast, we encounter Pantelleria, Italy notable for its beautiful wild scenery that includes volcanic formations, hot springs, and a rocky coastline.

Joining us will be Vanderbilt's **Professor of History, Jane Landers** who will contribute her expertise and knowledge in a series of lectures and discussions throughout the voyage.

Our vessel for this extraordinary journey, the Swan Hellenic *Diana*, is a state-of-the-art, new-generation expedition cruise ship, launched in early 2023. Accommodating only 192 guests in beautifully appointed staterooms and balcony suites, *Diana* features several lounges, a restaurant, outdoor café, spa, library and beauty salon, and is equipped with the latest safety and environmentally-friendly technology.

I look forward to hosting this trip and to welcoming Vanderbilt travelers aboard *Diana* to discover some of the remarkably rich stories of the *Ancient Cities of Iberia & North Africa: A Voyage from Lisbon to Sicily.*




Jane Landers is the
Gertrude Conaway
Vanderbilt Professor of
History and Director of
the Slave Societies Digital
Archive at Vanderbilt
University. SSDA preserves
the oldest and largest
collection of historical
documents for Africans in
the Atlantic World. Since
2015 she has served as the

U.S. member on UNESCO's International Scientific Committee for the Routes of Enslaved Peoples.

Her award-winning monographs include *Black Society in Spanish Florida and Atlantic Creoles in the Age of Revolutions* and she is the co-author or editor of five other books. She has also published more than seventy journal articles and book chapters dealing with the history of Africans in Florida and in the Atlantic World. Her research has been supported by the Historical St. Augustine Research Institute, the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation, the National Endowment for the Humanities, the American Council of Learned Societies, and the Gilder Lehrman Center for the Study of Slavery, Resistance, and Abolition, among others.


Landers currently serves on the editorial boards of the William & Mary Quarterly, the Cambridge History of the Caribbean, Carolina Lowcountry and the Atlantic World, PerspectivasAfro, Esclavages & post-esclavages, Atlantic World, and Slavery & Abolition.















Built in Finland, and launched in April 2023, Swan Hellenic's *Diana* is a new generation expedition cruise ship. Although at 12,100 tons the ship is large enough to accommodate more than 350 passengers, *Diana* will accommodate a maximum of 192 guests in 96 spacious staterooms and balcony suites. The low guest density results in one of the most generous indoor and outdoor space-to-guest ratios among cruise ships.

Featuring the latest advances in technology and engineering, *Diana* is among the world's first environmentally responsible ships. Equipped with hybrid engines and a unique water filtration system, *Diana* leaves a minimal footprint. For cruising in Polar regions, the ship meets the stringent requirements of the new Polar Code with its high PC5 Category A ice strengthened hull and other advanced features. A computer-controlled Dynamic Positioning System allows the ship to maintain position without anchoring. Operated by a complement of 135 experienced European officers and international crew members, *Diana* will

carry a fleet of Zodiacs, versatile landing boats, and kayaks. Powerful stabilizers provide a smooth ride.

Diana's interior spaces exude sophisticated elegance, with most rooms opening to panoramic views of the sea. All staterooms and suites face outside and are equipped with private facilities, climate control, TV, Wi-Fi and USB connections and other amenities. Of the ship's 96 staterooms, 76 have balconies. Public areas include a spacious observation lounge equipped with state-of- the-art facilities for lectures and presentations; a club lounge; a restaurant that accommodates all guests at one seating; an outdoor café/bar that surrounds the heated swimming pool; a wellness area with gym, spa, and sauna with an adjoining outdoor jacuzzi; library; beauty salon; and an infirmary that is attended by a full-time doctor and nurse. The ship also features expansive open-deck areas. Two elevators connect all decks. Attentive service is provided on a 24-hour basis. The outstanding cuisine is complemented by fine wines at lunch and dinner.



Saturday, August 9, 2025 **DEPART THE US**

Sunday, August 10 LISBON, Portugal

Arrive in Lisbon. Transfer to the *Avenida Palace Hotel* (or similar). In the evening, meet fellow travelers for a welcome dinner. (D)

Monday, August 11 **LISBON/EMBARKATION**

Following breakfast at the hotel, tour Lisbon's highlights including the Belém Quarter and the Jerónimos Monastery, a UNESCO World Heritage monument that is a superb example of Portuguese Manueline style. Also visit historic Belém Tower, the point from which many Portuguese explorers, including Vasco da Gama, set sail. Following the tour, transfer to the port to embark on *Diana*, where a light lunch will be served. Sail in the evening. (B,L,D)

Tuesday, August 12

LAGOS

Your gateway to the Algarve, the seaside town of Lagos served as an outpost and trading center for Phoenicians, Greeks, Carthaginians, and Romans. Its heyday, however, was in the 15th and 16th centuries, when Lagos played a major role in the Portuguese exploration of Africa, South America, and South and East Asia. A walking tour of the old town, including the Municipal Museum, the extravagant Church of Santo Antonio, and the 16th-century walls. After lunch aboard, take an excursion to Sagres and Cabo de São Vicente, where, in the 15th century, Prince Henry the Navigator established his famed school of navigation. Magellan, Vasco da Gama and other explorers studied at the school. (B,L,D)

Wednesday, August 13

TANGIER, Morocco/TÉTOUAN

Founded by the Phoenicians in the seventh century BC, Tangier was

ruled by Arabs in the early 8th century, when it and nearby Tétouan were used as bases for the invasion of southern Spain. Explore Tangier, a classic Moroccan town of narrow lanes and stepped passages, dominated by a kasbah. Then travel to Tétouan, which was rebuilt in the 15th century by Andalusian refugees who had been expelled during the Spanish reconquest. Although it is a small medina, Tétouan is among the most authentic, having been largely untouched by later outside influences. (B,L,D)

Thursday, August 14

SEVILLE, Spain

Occupied by the Romans, conquered by Islamic invaders, and ruled by a succession of Catholic monarchs, Seville is one of Europe's most important and affluent maritime cites. After docking in the city along the banks of the Guadalquivir River, explore the Alcazar, the oldest royal palace still in use in Europe and a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Travel to the historic Barrio Santa Cruz, a neighborhood of labyrinthine streets and alleys dating to the Middle Ages, when it was the old Jewish Quarter. Enjoy some time at leisure, as the ship remains docked overnight. (B,L,D)

Friday, August 15

SEVILLE

This morning, tour Seville's large and fanciful Gothic Cathedral—the largest Gothic cathedral in the world and the burial site of Christopher Columbus. See the Cathedral's main points of interest, including the Capilla Mayor and La Giralda—the intricately detailed bell tower that is the city's most well-known symbol. Also visit Maria Luisa Park, once a private garden attached to the Palace of San Telmo, now Seville's largest public green space. (B,L,D)

Saturday, August 16

AT SEA

Today you may attend lectures from your guest lecturer and briefings from the expert expedition staff, simply relax and enjoy cruising the open sea, or perhaps treat yourself to some of *Diana's* many amenities. (B,L,D)

Sunday, August 17

ALGIERS/TIPASA, Algeria

Located about 40 miles west of Algiers, Tipasa's ancient temples and ruins overlook the Mediterranean to dramatic effect. Visit the Villa of Frescoes, a Roman mansion; the 2nd-century Judicial Basilica; a 4th-century Christian Basilica and the site's museum. Return to the ship for lunch, and in the afternoon explore Algiers, including the Casbah and the National Museum of Antiquities and Islamic Art. (B,L,D)

Monday, August 18 **BÉJAÏA/DJÉMILA**

From the port of Béjaïa, a drive into the hills of the interior brings us to Djémila, which the UNESCO World Heritage Convention describes as "one of the world's most beautiful Roman ruins." The site includes a Triumphal Arch to Emperor Caracalla, built in AD 216; Grand Baths; a market; and the Old Forum, featuring stunning friezes and



a 3rd-century altar. Also visit the local museum, exhibiting a superb collection of mosaics and other artifacts. (B,L,D)

NOTE: The drive from Béjaïa to Djémila takes almost 4 hours. For those travelers who would rather avoid this drive, a shorter tour of Béjaïa will be available.

Tuesday, August 19

ANNABA/HIPPO REGIUS

Annaba is home to the ancient site of Hippo Regius, once ruled by Phoenicians, Romans, Vandals, and Byzantines, among others. Explore Hippo's Roman Forum, the largest and oldest in North Africa, and visit the Baths dedicated to Septimius Severus. At the nearby modern Basilica of St. Augustine, we will enjoy the hilltop view over the ruins and the rest of the city before visiting the basilica proper, which is dedicated to the author of the *Confessions* and *The City of God*, Bishop of Hippo, in the early 5th century. (B,L,D)

Wednesday, August 20

TUNIS, Tunisia

From Tunis, travel to storied Carthage, a Phoenician stronghold from the 9th century BC. The site includes several Phoenician remains, including Tophet, the sanctuary of the gods Tanit and Baal, as well as many monuments from the Roman period. Returning to Tunis,



we explore the Bardo Museum, world-renowned for its spectacular collection of Roman mosaics. After lunch aboard, explore Sidi Bou Said, a charming town of cobbled streets, characteristic blue and white houses, shops and cafes, set on a promontory overlooking the Mediterranean. (B,L,D)

Thursday, August 21

PANTELLERIA, Italy


Situated between Tunisia and Sicily, and inhabited since the Neolithic period, the island of Pantelleria is notable for its beautiful wild scenery that includes volcanic formations, hot springs, and a rocky coastline. The small main port town is dominated by the Castello Barbacane, an imposing castle that was first built by the Arabs. Explore the island, including its picturesque villages, with their traditional stone houses, its extinct volcanoes that dominate the island's center, and Lake Venere, an inland crater-lake that is fed by hot water. (B,L,D)

Friday, August 22

PALERMO, Sicily

After breakfast aboard, disembark and transfer to the airport for flights homeward. (B)





All accommodations aboard *Diana* are spacious staterooms and balcony suites. 
