The institute was established to further Vanderbilt's position as a leader in pedagogical innovation and excellence. As faculty across Vanderbilt continue to shape the future of teaching and learning, the institute recognizes the opportunity to support faculty in transcending the traditional constructs of education and reimagine learning experiences for Vanderbilt students around the world. AdvancED will help lead the way into the future and continue to serve as Vanderbilt University's hub for all pedagogical excellence and innovation needs across modalities.

Digital & Lifelong Learning

AdvancED seeks to expand Vanderbilt's impact through the development of innovative digital and lifelong learning programs, including online and hybrid credit-bearing degrees and certificates, non-credit offerings and massive open online courses (MOOCs). As the hub for digital and lifelong learning, we partner with units across campus to facilitate innovative learning experiences, from ideation through launch, delivery and ongoing management. Services include market research, project management, digital marketing and enrollment support, instructional design and digital media. Our goal is to ensure that the lifelong learning experiences we create are not only inclusive, collaborative and rigorous, but also unique to Vanderbilt University.

Educational Technology

As the administrative home for educational technology across campus, including the university's learning management system, Brightspace, AdvancED's EdTech team, situated within AdvancED, provides both technical and pedagogical support for faculty, staff and students using EdTech tools and resources. The EdTech team provides a core set of digital tools designed to enhance and support teaching and learning across campus, detailing on-demand resources that ensure educators are set up to achieve academic success in the classroom. The EdTech team also drives the strategic adoption of emerging learning technologies that have the potential to strengthen both residential teaching and online education, positioning Vanderbilt University as a leader in educational innovation and excellence.

Scholarly & Innovative Teaching

Through AdvancED's teaching and learning support, we seek to foster scholarly and innovative teaching that engages all students and educators in transformative learning for the purposes of personal and academic growth, the co-creation of knowledge and the development of solutions to our world's greatest challenges. AdvancED offers teaching and learning support in three main areas:

- **Event programming:** From stand-alone workshops to cohort-based learning communities and more, our team offers extended programming that provides educators with opportunities to explore evidence-based best practices and become more effective teachers.
- **Collaborations:** Available at the unit, department or program level within Vanderbilt University, collaborations allow for the customization of educational development resources to enhance student learning and faculty success.
- **Consultations:** Focused on each instructor's specific needs, faculty engage with our team in strategic conversations that consider teaching context and address learning goals.

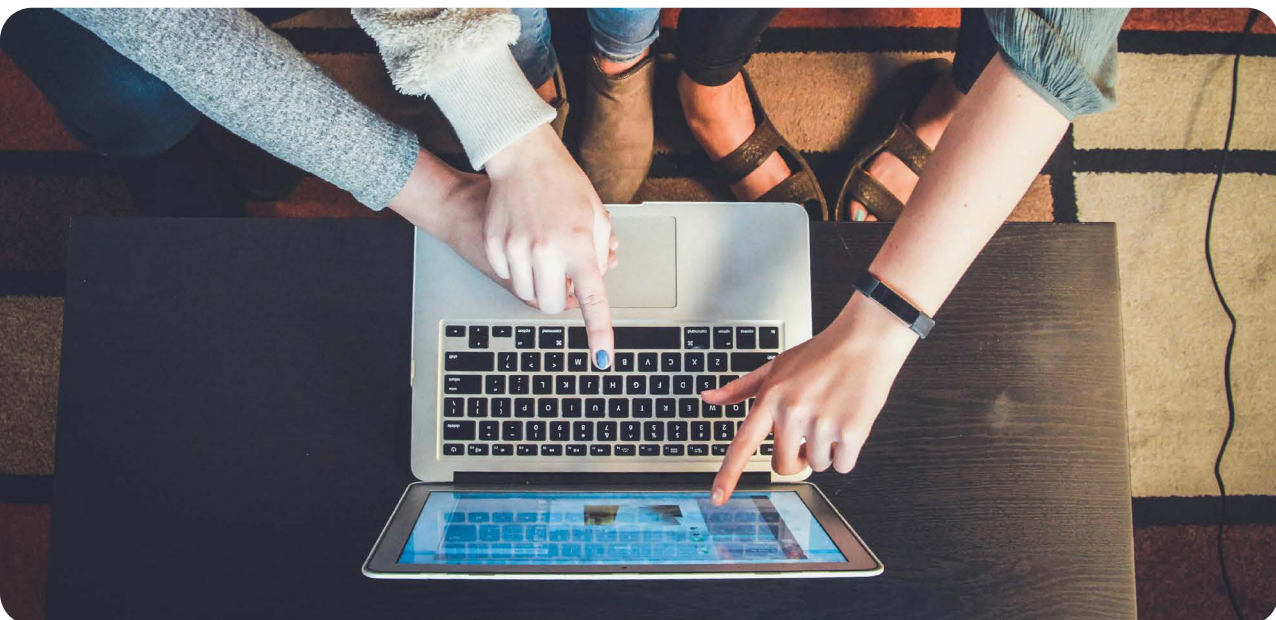
OBJECTIVE 1: LEAD IN DIGITAL & LIFELONG LEARNING

Vanderbilt Online, launched in April 2023, houses all of Vanderbilt University's online offerings. Vanderbilt Online was created from a vision of providing a centralized hub for all online learning opportunities for learners, simplifying the navigation process and enabling accessibility for all. This concept and vision led to its tagline: “**Immersive learning reimaged online**”, propelling Vanderbilt into the forefront of cutting-edge online education. Working directly with academic schools and colleges, AdvancED validated all information ensuring programs were marketed appropriately, highlighting their most important features. Built in partnership with external vendors Common Media and Upstatement, enhanced search functionality was implemented in November 2023.

This online platform introduced an efficient and seamless experience for our students. Saad Rajput, who immigrated to the United States in 2012, now has the opportunity to obtain a Vanderbilt degree effortlessly, with all information readily accessible. Rajput is a current student in the Engineering Management online program within the School of Engineering.

Vanderbilt Online not only services students worldwide, but also Vanderbilt employees. Many staff have taken advantage of the tuition discount, affording them the opportunity to prioritize advancing their education with Vanderbilt. For instance, Nadine De La Rosa, Director of Strategic Initiatives within Vanderbilt's Dean of Students office, is an alumna of Peabody College, having obtained a Leadership & Learning in Organizations doctoral degree.

Vanderbilt's commitment to fostering growth among its employees allowed Nadine to pursue this opportunity with Vanderbilt, exemplifying the university's dedication to providing accessible, high-quality education, empowering all to achieve their academic and professional goals.

Growing our digital footprint with the launch of the Master's of Legal Studies Program

The Office of Learning Innovation, situated within AdvancED, partnered with the Vanderbilt Law School to introduce the [Online Master of Legal Studies \(MLS\) program](#).

This program aims to provide non-lawyers with a deeper understanding of American law and legal systems in a 10 course, 30-credit hour program.

To facilitate the implementation of the MLS program, OLI offered a comprehensive range of services - instructional design, content development, digital media production and project management - ensuring a seamless and efficient implementation process. The MLS program welcomed its first cohort of students in Spring 2023 and has had a significant impact since its inception, with a total of 70 learners enrolled in the Master of Legal Studies program over the last year. The program is designed for people outside of the legal field and has attracted a diverse array of students; 19 enrollees are Vanderbilt employees, while 51 students represent a diverse array of professions including government officials, paralegals, real estate professionals and law enforcement. Learners chose our MLS program for numerous reasons including career goals, personal growth, advocacy for self and others and professional development. The MLS program was a significant investment by the team, resulting in the Digital Media Team developing 226 course videos. This culminated in a robust 10-course Master's program aimed at equipping students with the knowledge needed to work within the U.S. law.

Since the program's inception, enrollment has increased by 135.7%. This showcases the success and high demand for a program focused on delivering a comprehensive understanding of the U.S. legal system, equipping students with essential legal knowledge and skills to succeed in their careers.



"As we've developed this online degree program, we have invested heavily in understanding the gold standard of online education and recognize that online classes should not be simply videotaped versions of in-person classes. In fact, they should be intentionally designed from the ground up to be interactive and responsive, integrating readings, videos, quizzes and discussion posts. All the classes in the curriculum follow this pedagogical approach."

Unleashing Vanderbilt's global potential through MOOCs

The importance of meeting learners where they are remains a top priority at Vanderbilt University. With a vision to expand Vanderbilt's online program offerings to a global audience, Vanderbilt University partners with Coursera to deliver high-quality, accessible massive open online courses (MOOCs) to learners worldwide. Since the inception of the partnership, Vanderbilt University and Coursera have launched 33 courses and 12 specializations, with the majority of courses released in 2023 - 2024. These online courses have reached 2,556,394 learners in over 220 different countries, amplifying and enhancing the Vanderbilt brand. In the past year, many of these courses were designed by Jules White, senior advisor to the chancellor for generative AI in education and enterprise solutions. White has played a pivotal role in launching high quality, progressive courses that push the traditional boundaries of thinking, encouraging learners to embrace stepping outside of their comfort zone. White has launched 9 courses on the Coursera platform, most notably launching the first course on prompt engineering using ChatGPT, a trending topic across a variety of industries.

This course was met with tremendous success, garnering over 255,000 enrollments and impacting the lives of many. Shawn Keen, a 100% visually impaired individual, was one of these impacted learners, sharing that enrolling in Jules' course changed his life. Due to this technology, Keen had the opportunity to transition from working a state job to obtaining a sales manager position at [Envision](#), an AI technology company revolutionizing products for people with disabilities.

Additionally, Bob Higgins, CEO of [Barge Designs](#) and Vanderbilt University alumnus, saw the tremendous benefit coming from White's courses. Higgins co-designed and delivered the Generative AI Leadership & Strategy specialization with Jules White, which has over 5,000 learners enrolled to date. While Vanderbilt's previous generative AI Coursera courses focus on teaching the strategies behind using generative AI platforms, [the Generative AI in Leadership & Strategy Specialization](#) is geared towards equipping leaders with the skills needed to harness the full potential of generative AI, transforming leadership strategies and productivity in business and personal life. Higgins has encouraged his employees to enroll in these courses to further enhance their knowledge and skills.

Through these courses and expanded educational offerings for global learners, Vanderbilt University continues to cement its position as a global leader in the generative AI space.

Anchored in Success: tailoring student services to meet the needs of online learners

Upon reviewing our programs, AdvancED identified an opportunity to deliver a more tailored, curated set of services specifically designed to meet the unique needs of our online learners. With the launch of the Master of Legal Studies program, the Office of Learning Innovation piloted a tailored set of online services to provide online students with the support to belong, succeed, thrive and grow. As part of this piloted program, MLS learners now have access to a curated set of student services provided by our on-campus teams, re-imagined to fit their needs.

The services are offered through the following offices:

- Career Services
- Library Services
- Writing Studio
- Student Access & Accommodations
- Student Care Network
- Project Safe
- Equity, Diversity and Inclusion
- Financial Aid

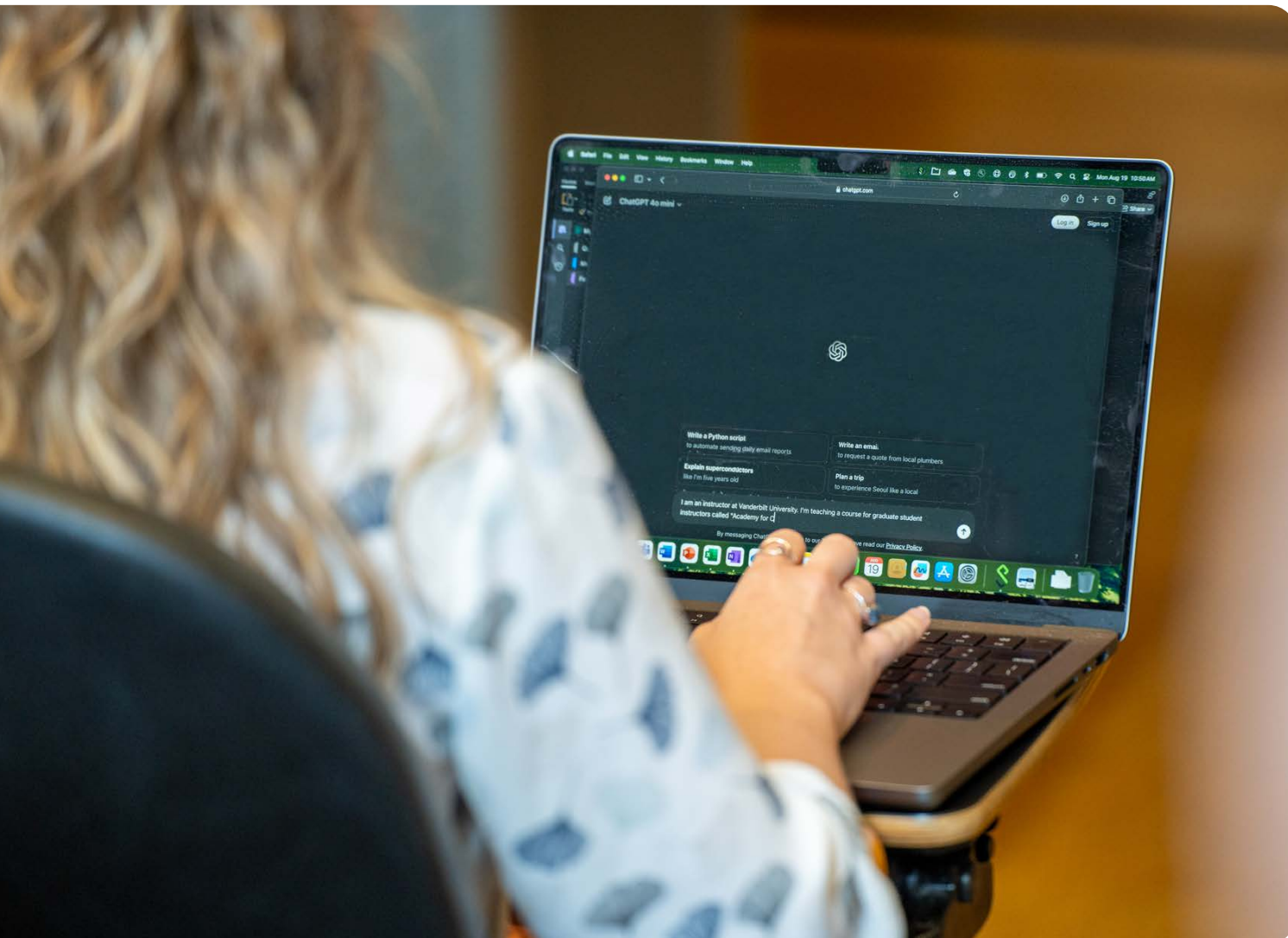
To orient students to the new support model, offices were highlighted in short form videos to introduce their teams, services and contact information.

With support from the Dean of Students and the Board of Trust, the online fee structure was designed as a reduced version of the residential fee model to align with the level of services and access needed. Starting in Fall 2024 this model will be the new standard across Vanderbilt's online campus community for the remaining 18 online and hybrid programs offered, further establishing Vanderbilt as an innovative leader in creating responsive and inclusive learning experiences.



OBJECTIVE 2: SUPPORT & ADVANCE CUTTING-EDGE LEARNING TECHNOLOGY

Leading the way in generative AI to meet the demands of the future



AdvancED plays a crucial role in shaping Vanderbilt's approach to generative AI by empowering our community to harness AI's potential in a responsible and secure manner, solidifying Vanderbilt's reputation as a leader in generative AI. After seeing the need for faculty, staff and students to find information about the use of generative AI at Vanderbilt, AdvancED took the initiative to strategically spearhead the development of [a centralized generative AI website](#). AdvancED collaborated with the Office of the Chancellor, the Office of Faculty Affairs and Professional Education, Student Accountability, Student Affairs and the Graduate School to develop a robust website that accurately and effectively provides guidance on generative AI use at Vanderbilt. After five months of research, composition, design and implementation the site was launched in January 2024, and includes:

- General guidance on best practices for using generative AI and building generative AI literacy
- Strategies for effective generative AI use for faculty, staff and students
- An overview of the initiatives, trainings, awards and grants currently available to Vanderbilt faculty, staff and students
- A curated catalog of generative AI courses and specializations designed by Vanderbilt faculty
- A dynamic news feed featuring staff, faculty and student achievements related Generative AI

Once the hub launched, AdvancED facilitated a series of workshops to strengthen use of generative AI in the classroom. These workshops were met with positive feedback from attendees, who found the content provided to be beneficial and applicable to their craft. Following these workshops AdvancED sponsored the Innovation in Teaching: Generative AI award in order to continue to encourage thoughtful and creative approaches to using generative AI in the classroom.

The work didn't end there. Vanderbilt forged ahead to the next level, creating its own generative AI platform, [Amplify](#). In 2023, Jules White and team developed Amplify, a secure private-access gen software with custom features and solutions. This platform provides the VU community a safe, cutting-edge environment for innovation, ensuring equity for all.

AdvancED provided project management support for the Phase 1 pilot of the Amplify platform, bringing together stakeholders from various offices across campus to approve and ensure the success of Phase 1. Completed in a month, the initial phase targeted superusers of generative AI in order to evaluate the viability of the platform, identify bugs and early pain points in the platform and recruit champions to drive campus-wide adoption. When feedback was requested from Phase 1 superusers, 93.3% reported they were either satisfied or very satisfied with the platform. Due to this success, Phase 2 launched in Spring 2024, with over 719 users (and increasing) accessing the platform.

Through the phased implementation approach, feedback indicated significant training was needed to efficiently navigate the platform. In response, AdvancED created detailed training materials to ensure everyone has the necessary resources to succeed. As Amplify continues to evolve, AdvancED is poised to provide on-going support to ensure a successful campus-wide launch in FY25.

Vanderbilt University demonstrated national leadership among universities by making the decision to disable Turnitin's AI detection. AdvancED effectively and transparently communicated the rationale for this decision: the lack of data and transparency from Turnitin, through the blog post ["Guidance on AI Detection and Why We're Disabling Turnitin's AI Detector."](#) This post has received over 45,000 views, being featured on top news sites such as Journal of the Medical Library Association, Wired, Business Insider, Inside Higher Ed and Bloomberg. AdvancED's holistic approach has allowed Vanderbilt to capitalize on the power of generative AI to catalyze innovations in teaching, research and learning.

Supporting the campus community in the use of educational technology tools

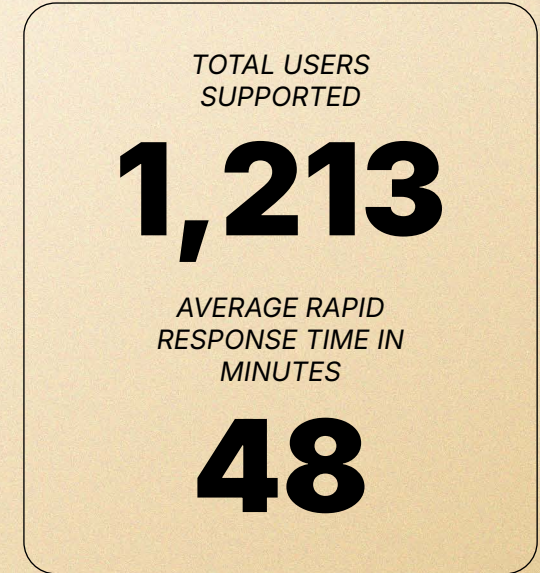
Our dedicated [EdTech](#) team within AdvancED provides both technical and pedagogical support for instructors using the Brightspace platform throughout Vanderbilt University's campus. Throughout fiscal year 24, our EdTech team supported 1,213 users, with an impressive average rapid response time of 48 minutes. Support for these users extends across a range of areas, including online course development, strategic implementation and standard technical support.

In addition to our support efforts, our team performed significant upgrades to Vanderbilt's integrated learning management toolkit, transitioning from Learning Tools Interoperability (LTI) 1.1 to LTI 1.3, the most up to date version. While LTI technology rarely needs updates, its updates bring with them significant improvements in the ease of use for integrated tools. Every third-party company that relies on this technology to communicate with learning management systems must update their systems to reflect the new version, and our team then must reintegrate each of these tools to ensure they're operating in the most current version. Furthermore, our EdTech team facilitated the onboarding of three new tools, elevating Vanderbilt's technological arsenal:

- Hawkes Learning: a courseware and textbook publisher
- MATLAB Grader: An automated platform for grading
- Aktiv Learning: A STEM student engagement platform

The EdTech team engages a comprehensive strategy when developing their workshops, ensuring a comprehensive workshop catalog is available for instructors to ensure their desire to learn how to use Brightspace tools effectively is nurtured. Relevant offerings include an Introduction to Brightspace series for new users, workshops focused on the team's supported external tools and timely webinars and workshops to highlight new developments in the world of educational technology.

With a total of 4,389 constituent interactions in FY24, our EdTech team remains dedicated to providing top-tier, accessibility-friendly support within the Vanderbilt community.



Piloting innovative tools to meet the demands of today's learners

Continuing education is at the ethos of Vanderbilt's brand identity. Historically, all non-credit offerings were housed within the Brightspace Continuing Education platform. After a thorough evaluation into our online learning experience, we discovered an opportunity to reimagine the learning experience for our non-credit learners, with a learning platform tailored to their specific needs. With this feedback, the Office of Learning Innovation embarked on a software needs assessment to pilot a new learning platform, which led to the launch of [NovoEd](#), a Learning Management System (LMS) designed to meet the needs of professionals who want to continue their lifelong learning journey. NovoEd provides a social learning environment that emphasizes collaboration and project-based learning.

As Vanderbilt's first offering, the Office of Learning Innovation partnered with Vanderbilt's School of Nursing to develop and deliver a set of micro-credentials within the new system. Currently, the Office of Learning Innovation is creating a second program, the Applied Drug Discovery & Development certificate, in conjunction with Vanderbilt's School of Medicine slated to launch in 2025.

Additionally, the Owen Graduate School of Management Executive Education successfully transitioned and launched 10 programs on NovoEd, while the LMS was simultaneously utilized to facilitate learning materials for Vanderbilt's Leadership Academy. These transitions showcase Vanderbilt's commitment to providing unique learning experiences and top-tier courses, through platforms that are cutting-edge, flexible and ensure a seamless educational experience.



OBJECTIVE 3: FOSTER SCHOLARLY AND INNOVATIVE TEACHING

Elevating Vanderbilt's faculty through evidence-based teaching and learning support

The Office of Education Design and Development (OEDD) within AdvancED provides instructional development to support, foster, and develop evidence-based pedagogy. The Office of Education Design and Development's goal is to engage all students and educators in transformative learning experiences for the purposes of personal and academic growth. A variety of educational programs contribute to this goal, including faculty and teaching assistant orientations, high impact professional development workshops, liaison programs and curated stand-alone programs. Some of the OEDD's liaison programs are collaborations with Arts & Sciences (Core Pilot), Blair School, School of Medicine, School of Engineering and School of Nursing. In the 2023-24 academic year, across programs there were 49 workshops offered with a combined total of 569 participants attending. OEDD is valuable for the resources it makes available, but also for the space it creates for faculty to share their own ideas.

A participant from the Inclusive Lab Pedagogies faculty learning community summarized this idea when they said,

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“One of the most useful takeaways was the recommendation to share course materials, such as syllabi, with each other. This open exchange of ideas allowed us to gain new perspectives and incorporate innovative approaches that we may not have considered on our own.”

In September 2023, OEDD launched a pilot program called the New Faculty Teaching Academy (NFTA). This series of workshops highlighted Vanderbilt faculty resources and best practices in course design, assessment and student feedback, time management and student engagement challenges. The NFTA program involved 23 participants, 12 of whom sought out one-on-one meetings with our AdvancED staff to think through thoughtful approaches for making a positive impact in the classroom. A key feature of this program was the opportunity for faculty to observe accomplished teachers from across the university, as well as observe one another's class preparation and teaching.

Strengthening the quality of academic offerings through high-touch models

AdvancED holds one-on-one consultations to personalize learning solutions for individual instructors. Offered by appointment, consultations typically begin with a question from an instructor about how to handle a particular classroom or learning dilemma. Professional staff share resources, provide options and brainstorm with faculty in a safe space to create a plan for addressing the issue.

Building a foundation for teaching success through top-tier resources

In addition to programming, AdvancED offers a wide range of teaching guides. Teaching guides are written summaries of best pedagogical practices in specific contexts, ranging from the first day of class to increasing civility in the classroom and beyond. Typically three to five pages in length, each guide builds on scholarship of teaching and learning (SoTL) literature and provides actionable steps for faculty to implement in their teaching in order to advance student learning. With a comprehensive collection of 82 teaching guides, we provide important information to faculty highlighting key items such as high-impact practices, important online resources and local Vanderbilt resources. The guides, on average, garner 500,000 website visits per quarter, showcasing their significant impact in enhancing teaching effectiveness not only at Vanderbilt, but in institutions of learning across the world.

Throughout this academic year, we will offer a series of workshops organized around various "high-impact practices" (HIPs) in teaching and learning as defined by extensive research by the

[American Association of Colleges & Universities \(AAC&U\)](#). Using millions of data points collected via the [National Survey of Student Engagement \(NSSE\)](#), HIPs are those teaching practices that have demonstrated significant educational benefit for students, especially those who are historically underserved and underrepresented in higher education. This year's workshops will cover topics including navigating difficult conversations, ungrading, applying gamification in the classroom, inclusive assessment and more. 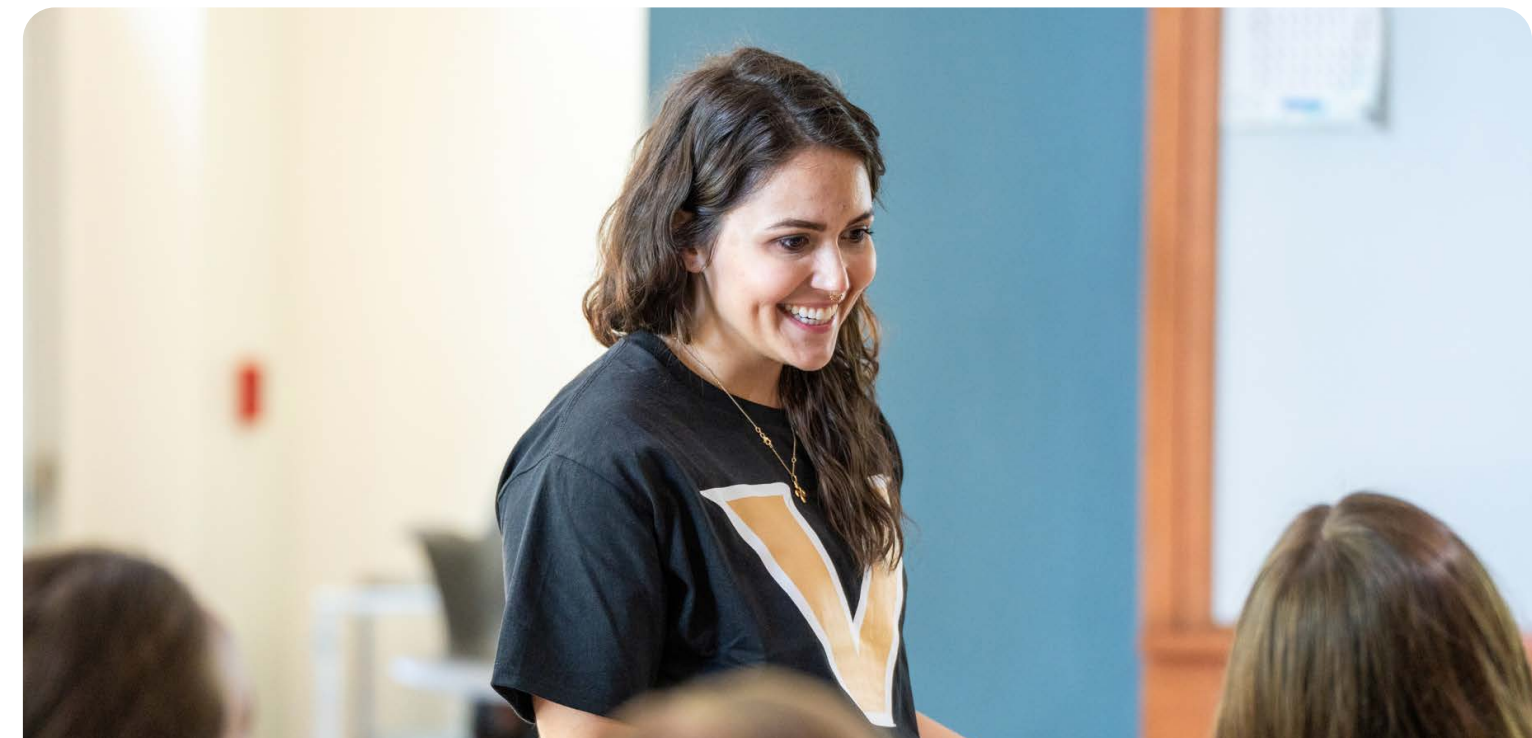
to expand Vanderbilt's online portfolio, ensuring global education access for all.
