Available on Google Play and the Apple Store, <u>VandySafe</u> is Vanderbilt University's public safety application. Users can connect with VUPD via phone call or chat, submit iReports, initiate a "virtual walkhome," access resources such as Facilities, Employee Assistance Program (EAP), and more.

Register to receive AlertVU emergency notifications



<u>AlertVU</u> rapidly sends messages to the delivery points the user has chosen–cell phone (voice or text), landline, and Vanderbilt email account–in the event of an emergency that poses an imminent threat or danger to the Vanderbilt community.

Complete the FERPA Tutorial

The <u>Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)</u> is a federal law designed to protect the privacy of education records, to establish the right of students to inspect and review their educational records, and to provide guidelines for the correction of inaccurate and misleading data through formal and formal hearings. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education. Research and Innovation Early Action Items for New Faculty

To ensure that you're able to get your research and innovation activities up and running as quickly as possible, the Office of the Vice Provost for Research and Innovation recommends you connect with their team <u>before your arrival on campus</u> to begin advancing any or all of the following:

- Existing grants or contracts moving from your previous institution? Reach out to Sponsored Programs Administration (SPA) to begin transfer of existing grants and/or contracts from your previous institution to VU.

- Research materials, patents, or licenses moving from your previous institution? Reach out to the <u>Center for Technology Transfer and Commercialization (CTTC)</u> to transfer research materials or pursue a research license (if you are using existing inventions in your research at VU) from your previous institution to VU.

- Computing and storage needs, including help managing sensitive data? Consult
 with the <u>Advanced Computing Center for Research and Education (ACCRE)</u> to set up
 the computing environment needed to handle your research data, including sensitive
 data

- Human research participants or animal subject protocols? Consult with Research Integrity and Compliance (RIC) to begin the process of submitting protocols for IRB or IACUC approval at VU (even if your protocol was approved at your previous institution, it will require a new review and approval at VU) and ensure that the IRB and/or IACUC teams are ready to support your human or animal research needs.
