

## Vanderbilt campus expands plastic recycling

Just in time for a strong finish in RecycleMania, the Vanderbilt campus recycling program is expanding plastics recycling to include all plastic containers! Previous recycling vendor restrictions only allowed for recycling plastic bottles with resin codes 1 and 2 on Vanderbilt's

the work to implement the FSC rules and procedures within the organization, VUPS will be able to provide FSC-certified printed matter to any customer desiring their order to carry the well-known and respected certification mark. In addition to the FSC mark, customers also will be offered the option to add the Rainforest Alliance mark to their FSC-certified jobs. VUPS is working with the Printers Green Resource LLC InGreen Program to complete the work necessary and expects to be fully certified no later than mid-April. ### Nashville rolls out green roof on new convention center



Downtown Nashville's new convention center will feature a four-acre green roof, which is scheduled to be completed by the end of March. The green roof,

which is being installed by Landscape Support Services of Murfreesboro, is being put in place to avoid urban storm-water runoff and as an added benefit may provide some insulation to the convention center.

In Nashville, when heavy storms hit, the combined storm water and sewer systems can overflow causing raw sewage to wash into creeks and the Cumberland River.
