

One day to get our neighbors, friends and community leaders excited about what can be accomplished when we all work together. One day to make recycling bigger and better 365 days a year. In recognition of Campus Sustainability Day, observed on October 24, 2012, Vanderbilt released an updated inventory of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions inclusive for calendar years 2005 through 2011. The GHG emissions inventory illustrates Vanderbilt's current carbon footprint and provides trending information over the past seven years. Overall GHG emissions from the campus and medical center decreased by 12 percent from the all-time high reached in 2008 and by 7 percent from 2005 to 2011, even though VU has seen significant growth in square footage, staff, students, and research dollars since 2008. Vanderbilt has also seen a 21 percent reduction in total emissions per 1,000 gross square feet (GSF) and a 19 percent reduction in total emissions per person since 2005.

The Smart Modal Area Recharge Terminal, or <u>SMART station</u>, can accommodate 10 vehicles and joins five other stations scattered across the university campus and medical center, bringing the total number of EV charging bays at Vanderbilt to 19.

Peter Pintauro, H. Eugene McBrayer Professor of Chemical Engineering and chair of the chemical and biomolecular engineering department, has


