Green Purchasing

- Buy printer paper, notebooks, and supplies with recycled content.
- Buy re-usable water bottles and shopping bags.

Reduce

- Electricity: Turn off lights, computers, printers, and other electronics when not in use.
- Water: Turn off water when not in use, such as when brushing teeth. Tell your <u>Area Maintenance Supervisor</u> about water leaks and dripping faucets.
- Paper: Print only when necessary and on both sides of the paper.
- Food Waste: If you think you might throw it away, take it to-go or ask for less.

Reuse

- Paper: The blank side of old papers can be used one more time.
- Plastic Bottles: Fill-up a reusable water bottle at fountains and dining halls.
- Vandy FreeSwap: An online resource for the Vanderbilt Community to exchange unwanted items.

Recycle

Take your recycling to the residence hall recycling area nearest you.



- Aluminum: Rinsed beverage and food cans.
- Mixed Paper: Phone books, magazines, fliers, newspapers, paper board, cereal boxes, junk mail, old papers.
- Plastic: Recycle items with a #1 through #7 in the recycling triangle symbol. NO PLAS-TIC BAGS, please!
- Cardboard: Remove all packaging and flatten.
- Glass: Take glass to the recycling center behind the Commons Center.
