In this Vanderbilt University Digital Humanities research cluster, we used <u>Voyant-Tools</u> to dissect and analyze past and current trends in literature using word frequencies and correlations (data mining) across the landscape of three languages and cultures: French, German and Spanish. We examined nationalist poetry during the interwar period to investigate differences and similarities across cultures in national rhetoric and how this corresponds to an overall understanding of the relationship of art in response to crisis.
