Comments

This class challenged my way of thinking through its reading, robust class discussions, and thoughtful feedback from Dr. Loss.

Dr.Loss's writing feedback was very helpful! I became more confident in my writing and felt confident contributing to course discussion.

Dr. Loss' focus on writing techniques was a really unique aspect of this course. He trusted us all to do the reading and come to class with thoughts to discuss, but pushing us to develop our writing style to better communicate those thoughts was a welcome difference from other courses and extremely helpful. Also, as difficult as his open—ended questions often felt during class time, they really forced us to connect themes, dates, movements, and events into a more cohesive understanding of history.

The detailed feedback on our papers was invaluable for helping us improve our writing. The readings were well chosen (and there was about 50% more reading in this course than any other course we've taken so far). Separating the readings by topic and giving us guiding questions helped us focus our efforts. Couching course content about the history of higher ed within an analysis of academia's current problems provided more purpose to the course and more motivation to learn the content. The inclusive environment Chris created was really beneficial to fostering rich discussions as well. He was very intentional about greeting all students, acknowledging their contributions, calling on those we hadn't heard from as often, and praising everyone for their efforts. This safe space made it much easier to learn together.

The essay assignments and discussion during class.

I thought the selected readings represented broad and diverse views that was meaningful to my learning. Additionally, the prompted essay questions before class and then facilitated dialogue during class helped to reinforce connections between the readings, history, and contemporary issues in higher education. I also appreciated the ability to pull all of the learning together, towards the end of the course, into the innovation project. However, I think the most important element was Dr. Loss' feedback on our paper, that provided me with direct feedback and critical areas to focus and improve on. I have not experienced that in other classes.

Dr. Loss genuinely cared about our learning process and helping us to improve our writing.

I loved this class— Chris was an amazing instructor — I appreciated the thoughtfulness that went into structuring our class time to balance lecture and activities— I thought assignments were reasonable and helped me engage with the content and draw connections to my work. Class was engaging and thought provoking and assigned readings were interesting and really contributed to me overall learning/knowledge. What I appreciated the most was the time we spent reviewing strong writing skills and the feedback Chris gave on each of my papers—probably the best and most helpful feedback on my writing I've received since undergrad. THANK YOU! I know it takes a lot of time to give that level of thoughtful feedback and it is much appreciated!

I don't even know where to start, this class was so good. Feedback on writing, engaging class discussion, effective writing assignments, encouragement from the professor, helpful historical context. One of the best classes I've ever taken. This class had more reading than any other class in the program so far (by a good bit), but it was manageable, and once the expectations for depth of reading were set through the first weekend's discussions, it didn't seem so overwhelming. It was great that the work was finished by the end of the last class (though not every class could be that way). I learned so much in this class and felt like my learning was supported.

Starting right on time both at the start of class and after breaks could help us get through more material as scheduled. It was really hard to leave content we didn't have time to cover and return to it at the start of the next class meeting. While it's good to review old material at the beginning of the next class weekend, it's really hard to cover new material for the first time when there was a big time gap between the course readings and the lecture. I felt I didn't learn the "leftover" content quite as well as the rest of the course content because I couldn't make connections between my reading and the lecture/discussion as readily.

A bit more information about the final project expectations would also have been helpful. It wasn't quite clear what completing "a teaching exercise" meant. I also think we were primed by Adela's class to produce text—heavy PowerPoints because that's what she wanted, and that's the last time we gave a presentation that was graded. Understanding Chris' expectations for the project better would have given us a bit more confidence in carrying out the task.
