

Edifice Complex

Just a stone's throw from the Vanderbilt campus at the Dyer Observatory, the Star Chamber features an aperture in its top that allows images from the sky to be reflected onto the white-washed interior walls. Last fall, British land artist Chris Drury and volunteers, including students, used 150 tons of native limestone excavated from the Vanderbilt campus to build the domed structure behind the observatory, which is located on a hill six miles south of campus.
