


Incarceration Rates




In 2021, the US had an incarceration rate of 664 individuals per 100,000.


The incarceration rate of the state of TN specifically was 838, ranking the 11th highest state.



Community-Based Non-Profits



Founded in '84, they were the first agency in TN to implement the **Individual Placement and Support Model**.

They offer emerging adult, homeless outreach, and several therapy services.



Founded in '93, they offer emergency psychiatric services, substance abuse treatment, pharmacy & clinic access to children, teens, and adults, which includes individual and group therapy.

Founded in **2020**, The Behavioral Care Center is a state-licensed adult supportive treatment facility in the Davidson County Sheriff's Office.

Medicine

How do doctors provide hope in the margins of the prison system?

- About 50% of incarcerated persons have some form of substance use disorder
- 5% of people with opioid use disorder in jail or prison receive medication-assisted treatment (MAT)
- 12x more likely to die of opioid overdose upon release (vs. average population)
- **Overdose** is leading cause of death in this population

Doctors can provide MAT for incarcerated individuals with opioid use disorder \rightarrow reduce rates of overdose-related deaths upon release
