IS A HOUSEMATE A CAREGIVER?

Housemates are <u>not</u> responsible for the daily care of others but are expected to be an active part of the Friendship House community by being a good neighbor. You are not required to always be with your housemates, but are expected to spend at least 2-5 hours each week with others. That might be eating a meal together, watching sports or a movie on TV, or going on a walk.

WHAT IS THE HOUSING LIKE?

In shared living, residents have their own private BR/BA, but share common living areas — kitchen/dining, living room, laundry facilities, All common areas are furnished.

WILL I HAVE PRIVACY?

All residents have their own room approximately 11'x14' in size that is key-code locked. You can have as much private time as you want, while also having opportunity for social activty in the common areas.

WHO HELPS MANAGE THE HOUSE?

Each Friendship House community has a resident director who helps plan events and solve simple housemate conflicts (like dirty dishes or noise complaints) and communicates regularly with OPN staff. If you'd like to apply to be a resident director, please let us know in your application.
