

## PRECOLLEGE FIDDLE

## Crystal Plohman Wiegman, director

Ages 5 and up, 16 weeks

The Precollege Fiddling program offers a holistic approach in teaching, using the Suzuki philosophy to build solid technique and tone, along with the "Fiddle and Song" curriculum to teach traditional fiddle music. Introductory classical and historical folk styles, including old-time, bluegrass, Irish, Scottish, Texas swing, and other world styles are taught. Beginning students have 30-minute weekly private lessons and small group experience. Second-year and above students participate in the Fiddle Frenzy performance group, which gives students the opportunity to have fun playing and learning with peers.

The precollege semester is 16 weeks and includes 15 lessons and a jury/performance exam. New students may submit a need-based scholarship application at the time of registration, after having interviewed with a faculty member.
