

SUMMER REGISTRATION STEPS

STEP ONE: CREATE AN ACCOUNT ON VUPACE

Registration for all courses, lessons, classes, and ensembles can be accomplished on <u>VUPACE</u>. If you have not taken a course at the Blair Academy before, you will need to create a VUPACE account for the student and complete the <u>New Student Application</u>. Once this application is approved, you will receive confirmation via email, and you can then register for courses.

STEP TWO: FIND YOUR COURSE

You can visit the <u>Blair Academy Programs Page</u> on VUPACE for a complete listing of our offerings. Alternatively, you can search for your chosen course via the search bar in the upper-right corner.

STEP THREE: CHECK OUT

Once you have found your course, you can add the correct section to your cart and click the cart icon to begin the checkout process. Any additional required forms can be completed during checkout.

Dive into the world of video game music composition with MusicTech at Vanderbilt University. MusicTech offers an exceptional summer experience for teens with a passion for video game music and game design.

The program provides students with the foundational tools of digital music creation, combined with creative skills. You'll learn to compose original game music alongside likeminded technologists and industry experts.



MusicTech engages students through a combination of hands-on, production-based projects and group interactive experiences, learning a multitude of skills including Logic Pro and digital music composition.

Vanderbilt University's MusicTech is much more than the typical summer camp experience. Discover the difference with a friendly environment of radical acceptance and "geek culture" where kids form meaningful relationships, grow socially and have a summer to remember!

Camp sessions are conducted in small groups and led by award-winning staff and are appropriate for all levels of experience, from beginners to more experienced students.

PRIVATE LESSONS

The summer lesson period can be as short as three weeks or as long as fifteen weeks, as determined by teacher and student. Not all faculty members teach over the summer, however, so you will need to verify that your instructor will be available to teach lessons.

Ages 3 and up

Students in Partner Piano receive a combination of private and group piano instruction. In the group lesson, students learn rhythm, pitch, musical terms, and notation, using a variety of activities. Each student has a private lesson and a group lesson weekly.

PARTNER PIANO I

(Limited to children age 3) — \$77 30-minute private lesson and 30-minute group lesson weekly

PARTNER PIANO II

(Children age 4 and up) — \$96 30-minute private lesson and 30-minute group lesson weekly

PARTNER PIANO III — \$127.50 45-minute private lesson and 30-minute group lesson weekly

PARTNER PIANO IV — \$159.50 60-minute private lesson and 30-minute group lesson weekly



VANDERBILT SUZUKI PROGRAM

Ages 4 and up

Suzuki instruction develops musical skill and sensitivity, using listening and imitation, the same process used in learning language. Students gain poise and read music notation as they progress. New students as young as age 4 are welcome.

PRECOLLEGE FIDDLE

The Precollege Fiddling program offers a holistic approach in teaching, using the Suzuki philosophy to build solid technique and tone, along with the "Fiddle and Song" curriculum to teach traditional fiddle music. Introductory classical and historical folk styles, including old-time, bluegrass, Irish, Scottish, Texas swing, and other world styles are taught.

Beginning students have 30-minute weekly private lessons and small group experience. Second-year and above students participate in the Fiddle Frenzy performance group, which gives students the opportunity to have fun playing and learning with peers.

REGISTRATION

Blair uses an online registration and payment system, VUPACE. New students should visit <u>vupace.vanderbilt.edu</u> to create a profile and submit a new student application. After application approval, registration may be made online.
