

# REGISTRATION STEPS

# STEP ONE: CREATE AN ACCOUNT ON VUPACE

Registration for all courses, lessons, classes, and ensembles can be accomplished on <u>VUPACE</u>. If you have not taken a course at the Blair Academy before, you will need to create a VUPACE account for the student and complete the <u>New Student Application</u>. Once this application is approved, you will receive confirmation via email, and you can then register for courses.

# STEP TWO: FIND YOUR COURSE

You can visit the <u>Blair Academy Programs Page</u> on VUPACE for a complete listing of our offerings. Alternatively, you can search for your chosen course via the search bar in the upper-right corner.

# STEP THREE: CHECK OUT

Once you have found your course, you can add the correct section to your cart and click the cart icon to begin the checkout process. Any additional required forms can be completed during checkout.

# VANDERBILT FIDDLE PROGRAM

The Vanderbilt Fiddle Program offers a holistic approach in teaching, using the Suzuki philosophy to build solid technique and tone, along with the "Fiddle and Song" curriculum to teach traditional fiddle music. Introductory classical and historical folk styles, including old-time, bluegrass, Irish, Scottish, Texas swing, and other world styles are taught.



Beginning students have 30-minute weekly private lessons and small group experience. Second-year and above students participate in the Fiddle Frenzy performance group, which gives students the opportunity to have fun playing and learning with peers.


