■ Institutional & Local Organizations

Bishop Joseph Johnson Black Cultural Center: [Vanderbilt] enhances the Vanderbilt experience of Black students, faculty, and staff by providing effective programming and resources to address the academic, cultural, well-being, and social needs of the community.

Peabody Coalition of Black Graduates (PCBG): [Vanderbilt] Peabody student organization geared towards students of color that seeks to provide social support to its members. PCBG also plays an integral role in the recruitment and retention of minority students on Peabody's campus.

Association of Vanderbilt Black Alumni (AVBA): affinity alumni group as part of the Vanderbilt Alumni Association.

Callie House Research Center for the Study of Global Black Cultures and Politics: [Vanderbilt] housed within the African American and Diaspora Studies department in the College of Arts & Science.

National Coalition of 100 Black Women - Metropolitan Nashville Chapter: advocates on behalf of women of color in the Middle Tennessee area through national and local actions and strategic alliances that promote its national and international agendas on leadership development and gender equity in the areas of health, education, and economic development.

100 Black Men of Middle Tennessee, Inc. (The 100): a non-profit organization providing resources to further the academic and social development of black male students in Nashville and surrounding Middle Tennessee.

American Association of Blacks in Higher Education: pursues the educational and professional needs of Blacks in higher education with a focus on leadership, access, and vital issues impacting students, faculty, staff, and administrators.

Black Career Women's Network: the leading career development platform dedicated to fostering the professional growth and success of Black women.

Blacks in Government: advocacy organization for the employment and general welfare of Black employees in federal, state, and local governments.

BOND Educators [Building Our Network of Diversity]: committed to advancing efforts to recruit, develop, support, and retain male educators of color through professional enrichment, mentoring, scholarship, and fellowship activities.
