Institutional & Local Organizations

Tennessee Immigrant & Refugee Rights Coalition (TIRRC): statewide, immigrant, and refugee-led collaboration whose mission is to empower immigrants and refugees throughout Tennessee to develop a unified voice, defend their rights, and create an atmosphere in which they are recognized as positive contributors to the state.

National Organizations

Consideration of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA): information on requesting consideration of deferred action for childhood arrivals (DACA) from U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services within the U.S. Department of Homeland Security.

Define American: a culture change organization that uses the power of narrative to humanize conversations about immigrants.

Immigrant Legal Resource Center: works with and educates immigrants, community organizations, and the legal sector to help build a democratic society that values diversity and the rights of all people.
