

GRADUATE & PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATE from Vanderbilt Peabody College:

Pediatric Psychosocial Care

This certificate will prepare future youth-serving professionals with a unique set of research and practice skills to understand and respond to the psychosocial needs of children and families with special healthcare needs. Meeting these needs can lead to more positive healthcare encounters and improved behavioral, psychological and academic outcomes for the most vulnerable children and youth.



Through this certificate, students will develop knowledge and skills relevant to understanding the complex psychosocial needs of children, adolescents and families in health care settings and situations; to conducting pediatric healthcare research with children and their families; to identifying evidence-based techniques for improving the quality and efficacy of medical and psychosocial care and research with/for children; to identifying seminal and contemporary theories of loss and grief; and to examining interventions that positively impact loss and grief trajectories for children and families.
