Expanding Arts Internship Opportunities

The beginning of the semester is always exciting, especially when students start their internships. We consistently have students express interest in working in creative spaces, and we are so excited when we find the perfect fit for a student! This semester, we are partnering with several arts and creative partners, such as the Nashville Children's Theatre, National Songwriter's Association International, Andrew Jackson's Hermitage, Belmont Mansion, Smart Art & Craft Supplies, and Vanderbilt Theatre Scene Shop.

Hannah, Class of 2024, is interning at two of these sites, the Nashville Children's Theatre (NCT) and the National Songwriter's Association International (NSAI). At NCT, Hannah splits her time between the Education and Front of House teams. Hannah has had a lot of experience working with young children and is excited to get to combine her love of the arts with working with kids at NCT. With the Education team, she completes admin tasks such as setting up for classes, preparing supplies, and sorting materials. On her front of house days, she serves as an usher. She gets students off buses, welcomes them, and shows them where to sit in the theater. At NSAI, she helps with workshops, prepares for special events, and works with the Membership team to create community, resources for growth, and opportunities for songwriters in the Nashville area and across the globe.

Lucy, Class of 2024, is also interning at two of these sites, Andrew Jackson's Hermitage and Belmont Mansion. She works primarily with the Guest Services team at the Hermitage and is learning how to answer questions, give suggestions, and share history about the site.
