

GRADUATE & PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATE from Vanderbilt Peabody College:

Early Childhood Policy

This certificate will prepare graduates to work in early childhood education policy spaces and areas, including government agencies, advocacy organizations, program development, and evaluation.



Upon completion of the certificate, students will be able to communicate effectively to policymakers about the importance of early childhood education initatives at the local, state, and federal levels; advocate for research-backed early childhood education initiatives and programs; and translate ECP research to practice, such that it is accessible and digestible to practitioners in the policy arena.
