Social Impact Design and Evaluation

Social impact design and evaluation is growing in popularity and use. The Social Impact Design and Evaluation (SIDE) certificate is distinguished by drawing on departmental strengths and commitments to community engagement, participatory design and evaluation, program and policy creation, methodological pluralism, and justice-centered social analysis.



Upon completion of the certificate, students will be able to describe the value of social context analysis and careholder engagement in social impact design and evaluation, and develop tools for designing and implementing both; understand and employ the technical and tactical competencies associated with social impact design and evaluation; and ground social impact design and evaluation in principles and practices that foster equity and justice.

Required Hours: 12 credit hours are needed to earn this certificate. See the <u>certificate website</u> for course details.

Prerequisites: Completed bachelor's degree and current enrollment in a Vanderbilt graduate or professional degree program. Students must take HOD 6200 or LPO 6150 and HOD 7160 prior to taking the practicum course.
