Time Zones

Nashville, Tennessee goes by the Central Standard Time (CST). Please note that New York and Washington, D.C. are in Eastern Standard Time (EST), one hour ahead of Nashville time.

Arrival Information

You will arrive at <u>Nashville International Airport</u> (BNA). There are several ways to travel from the Nashville International Airport to your destination. Below is a list of some of the most common options. All transportation options listed depart from the Ground Transportation Center on Level 1 of Terminal Garage 2. To get to the center, exit the main terminal on Level 1 of the airport. Turn right and follow the signs that say: "Ground Transportation."

As a medium-size city, Nashville does not have the same highly developed mass transit system available in many of our larger cities. Nashville has WeGo, the public transit system.

Documentation if coming from outside of the US

Money

 Most places accept cash, but you will need an international credit or debit card to use in most apps like Uber, Lyft and for booking into your hotel. Many establishments also require card payments only.

Weather

In the United States, we measure temperature in Fahrenheit. When looking into the climate in Nashville, please adjust for this discrepancy.





Summer

The weather in Nashville during the summer (June to September) is very hot and humid. When you arrive, please note the temperatures will be 90 to 100F (32 to 37C) with very high levels of humidity. Most indoor public spaces have air conditioning and it is kept at about 70 – 75F; we have found that layering thin or cotton clothing can help you adjust to the differentials in temperature each day.

Fall – GEDF timing


During early fall (September to December), daily high temperatures will be cooler. Fall is a celebrated time throughout Tennessee. Visitors come from all over to see the annual changing of the leaves in mid-October. Temperatures range from 30 to 85F (0 to 30C) in the Fall. Most Fellows usually dress in layers with a warm coat. Rain boots and an umbrella are frequently required as well! During the Fall, many Fellows and Nashvillians have allergies because of the changing of the leaves.

Winter

In the winter (December to March), temperatures are cold. Small amounts of snowfall occur in Tennessee. On average, Nashville gets 7-10 days of snow each year, amounting to 9.1 inches. When it does snow, it usually melts away within a day or two. The temperatures range from 0 to 40F (-17 to 4C) in the winter, with many of the days below 32F (OC), so Fellows usually dress in layers with a very warm coat, hat, gloves, and warm shoes/boots.

Spring

The weather during the spring months (March to June) varies greatly. However, this is a beautiful time to be in Nashville with the flowers and trees blooming. Nashville can be very cold but also very warm. Temperatures range from 30 to 85F (0 to 30C). Additionally, we frequently get a lot of rain! Again, during the spring, many Fellows and Nashvillians have allergies because of the change of the pollen.

Clothing & Attire

For the Global Education Deans Forum (GEDF), we recommend business casual dress to ensure a comfortable and professional atmosphere.

Dress Suggestions:

- For Men: Collared shirts, dress slacks, and closed-toe shoes are appropriate. Blazers or sport coats are optional.
- For Women: Blouses or dress shirts paired with slacks or skirts are suitable. Dresses are also a good option.


General Tips:

Vanderbilt's Peabody College of Education and Human Development

Peabody College of Education and Human Development was founded in 1875 when the University of Nashville, located in Nashville, Tennessee, split into two separate educational institutions. The preparatory school, University School of Nashville, separated from the college, which was originally called Peabody Normal School, but soon became known as the George Peabody College for Teachers. Peabody merged with Vanderbilt University in 1979. Since 2005, the U.S. News & World Report



rankings have continually ranked Peabody as a top graduate school of education in the nation.

The curriculum is based on studying real-world problems and developing solutions. 
