



Ten (10) students with double majors are counted in each major.



73% OF THE CLASS OF 2017 INTENDED TO ENTER THE WORKFORCE.

- Of domestic students (US citizens or permanent residents), 82% had at least one job offer by graduation.
- Most international students return to their home country to seek work.
- The average reported starting salary increased by 5% from 2016 and the median reported starting salary increased by 1%.
- Domestic students headed to the workforce were more likely to receive a job offer if they earned an ENGM minor (88% vs. 79%).
- VUSE students are mobile; 79% accepted a job in a state other than their home state.

18% OF THE CLASS OF 2017 PLANNED TO ATTEND GRADUATE OR PROFESSIONAL SCHOOL.


Regarding those headed to graduate school:

- 55% expressed clear intention to pursue a doctorate.
- 70% planned to study engineering or computer science.
- Average reported annual stipend for graduate study was \$30,429, and the median was \$30,000 (N=25), both up from 2016.


Regarding those intending to enter medical school:

- 88% were admitted and with the remaining 12% waitlisted.

- Error bars indicate standard deviation of accepted salary offers.
- Salaries varied significantly by geographic region.

Data were drawn from the commencement program, VU student records, YES, and most of all from the VUSE "Survey of Future Plans" given in the month prior to commencement to all May 2017 graduates. The overall response rate was 98%.










