

Requirements for the Graduate Certificate in Religion, Gender and Sexuality Studies

- (1) Either GSS 8301: Gender and Sexuality: Feminist Approaches OR GSS 8303: Queer Theory
- (2) One graduate level course in method in the study of religion (such as REL 8900: The Study of Religion, REL 8006: The History of the Study of Religion, etc).
- (3) Three courses appropriate to the student's course of study that focus on religion, gender and/or sexuality. Courses must be approved for Certificate credit by the Director and must include one course outside the student's primary area of study.
- (4) A scholarly paper that demonstrates the student's ability to do high quality discipline-specific or interdisciplinary research on religion, gender, and sexuality. Typically, the paper will have been written to fulfill a requirement for one of the courses taken towards the certificate.
- (5) The total number of required didactic credits for this certificate: Minimum of 12 credit hours.
