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SPORTSMANSHIP

WHY TEACH IT?

Explicitly teaching sportsmanship in cooperative games can increase prosocial interactions among peers

ASPECTS OF SPORTSMANSHIP

- Using kind words
- Winning nicely
- Accepting losing
- Respecting teammates
- Following directions
- Handling conflict





HOW TO TEACH

INTRODUCE THE SKILL

- Teach 1-3 skills at a time
- Teach before playing the game



TEACH

- Give examples and nonexamples of what the skill looks like in the game.
- Allow kids to practice, ask questions, and respond during instruction
- Use visuals for increased support

REINFORCE

- Give <u>positive descriptive feedback</u> for appropriate behaviors
- Reward kids for using the skills


