



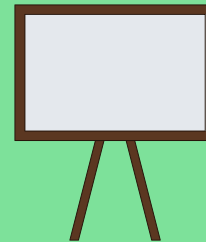

For younger children, teachers can draw things children may be able to recognize and have them guess what it is!

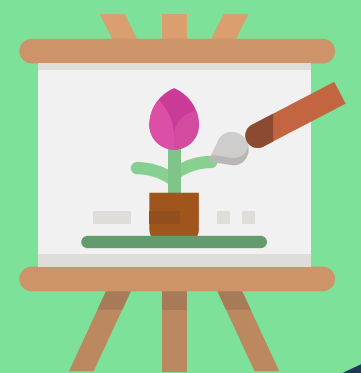
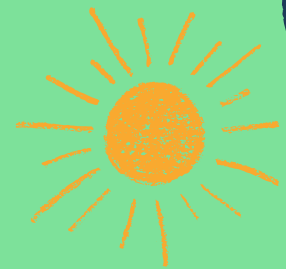


CONNECTION TO LEARNING

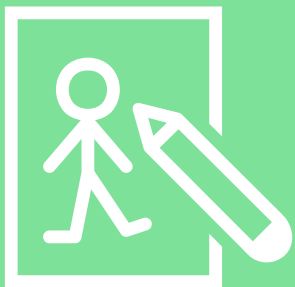
With this game, children can work on their fine motor skills, practice labeling things, and learn to take turns
