

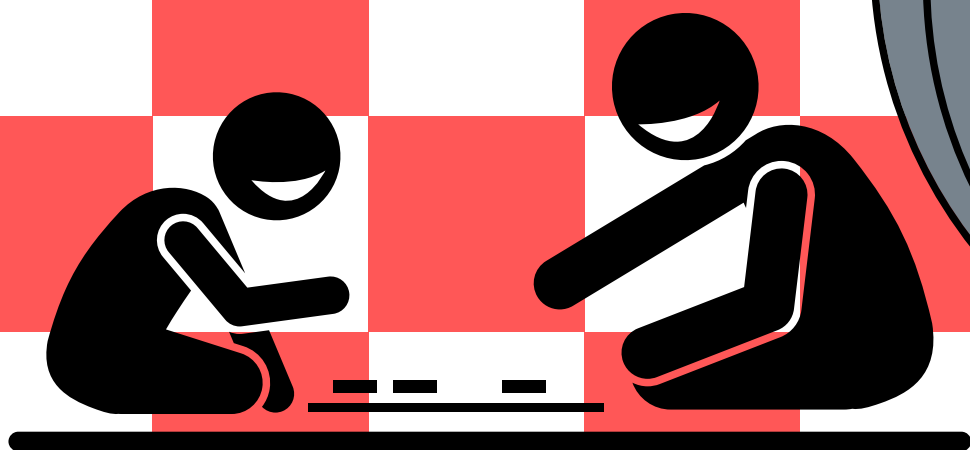

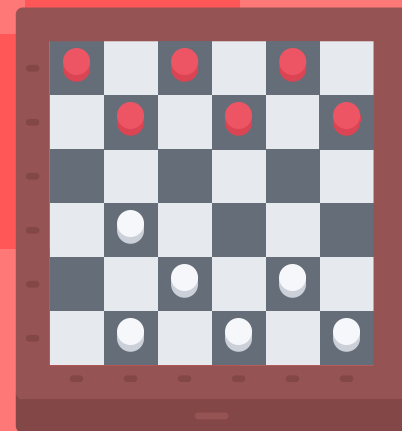


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CONVERSATION STACKER

GOAL

Build social skills by practicing taking conversational turns and staying on topic



MATERIALS

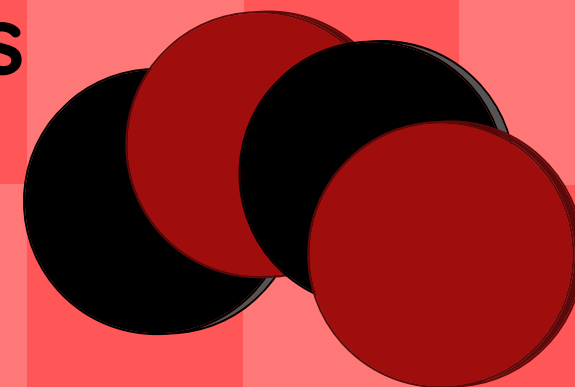
- Checkers pieces (or any stackable objects)
- Conversation starters, if needed



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HOW TO PLAY

Give everyone some pieces to stack



Start a conversation

Every time one person says something in turn and on topic, they get to put a piece on the tower

See how tall you can build your tower!



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SUPPORTING SKILLS

Give reinforcement (ex: praise, hi-5's) for trying to hold a conversation



If the child needs some support, try providing prompts
