

JENNIFER SPARKS, PHD

Division Program Manager in the Research and Development Directorate Defense Threat Reduction Agency



I'm very passionate about the work I get to do. Most days it doesn't feel like work. I love that I get to serve my nation and shape the direction of new chemical and biological scientific discoveries. While I am no longer at the bench, I interact with scientists from around the world regularly and get to work with an incredible team on a daily basis.

WHAT IS ONE STATEMENT YOU WOULD SAY ABOUT YOURSELF NOW THAT YOU WOULD NOT HAVE SAID 10 YEARS AGO?

I am happy with where I am right now, and I know where I want to go next. It took me a long time to find my way to my "dream job," but the journey was worth it! And I learned so much along the way.

CONSIDERING ALL THE PEOPLE YOU'VE MET IN YOUR FIELD, WHAT PERSONAL ATTRIBUTES ARE ESSENTIAL FOR SUCCESS?

The ability to inspire others, drive, subject matter expertise, the willingness to constantly learn, and humility

IS THERE ANY ADVICE YOU WOULD GIVE SOMEONE JUST ENTERING THE FIELD, MAYBE SOMETHING THAT

YOU WISH SOMEONE HAD MENTIONED WHEN YOU WERE STARTING?

The best advice I can give is to immediately work on expanding your network. Find people you admire and reach out to them. Find people with jobs you find exciting and reach out to them. Don't let yourself be deterred by seniority or rank. I've found that almost everyone is willing to share their experiences and lessons learned, especially those people in senior positions. The more people you meet, the better understanding and perspective you can get of your field. After you've met someone, develop authentic relationships with them and maintain your network. It's the people you know who become your best advocates throughout your career.


