THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

he undergraduate processional begins as the banner bearer, dean, and Founder's Medalist for each of the four undergraduate schools enter the stadium.

Entering from the rear of the audience are the representatives from the College of Arts and Science, including Dean John Geer. Their banner has a white field.

The representatives from the Blair School of Music, including Dean Lorenzo F. Candelaria, will then enter. Their banner has a pink field.

Blair is followed by the School of Engineering representatives, including Dean Philippe M. Fauchet. Their banner has an orange field.

Representatives from Peabody College, including Dean Camilla Benbow, will then enter. Their banner has a light blue field.

After the banners are placed and the deans have entered, the second part of the academic procession will enter. The order is: 2020 Chair of the Faculty Senate John McLean, carrying the mace

The graduate and professional degree recipients of the Divinity School, the Graduate School, the Law School, the School of Medicine, the School of Nursing, the Owen Graduate School of Management, and Peabody College will celebrate their Commencement in separate ceremonies.

The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak tree is a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity. The stylized oak leaf and acorn in the Vanderbilt logo were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The predominant colors in the Vanderbilt coat of arms are black and gold. The initial "V" has been used frequently throughout the years as an architectural detail on campus buildings. The Vanderbilt University wordmark incorporates two typefaces, graphically linking old and new, our history and our future.

The 2020 chair of the Faculty Senate carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university's authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The chancellor's insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder's Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. The decagonal silver frame of the medallion symbolizes the ten schools.

Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping on the velvet bars of the sleeves. The design of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor's degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black.

The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—open, pointed sleeves lined with dark blue satin to signify the Ph.D. Vanderbilt's custom gown for those receiving the doctor of philosophy has antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered "V" on the gown's yoke. Vanderbilt doctoral candidates wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D., D.N.P., or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, apricot for nursing, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines. Masters' hoods are edged with white for arts, brown for fine arts, gold for science, purple for law, salmon pink for public health, peacock blue for public policy, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

The Banner Bearers

Each banner, with a field in the appropriate academic color, is decorated with the Vanderbilt logo. In recognition of Peabody's history, a Peabody Centennial Medal in a round walnut frame is mounted above the banner. Banner bearers for the Class of 2020* are:

The Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is one of the university's highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols. The medal is presented at Vanderbilt University Graduates Day and also carries a monetary award.

The 2020 Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is presented to bestselling author, attorney, and former U.S. Ambassador to Japan Caroline Kennedy. The daughter of President John F. Kennedy and First Lady Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis, she has dedicated her life to public and philanthropic service. Kennedy was the first woman to serve as U.S. ambassador to Japan when she was nominated by President Barack Obama in 2013. During her tenure, she played a pivotal role in Obama's historic visit to Hiroshima and was an advocate for Japanese women in business and politics.

Kennedy has authored, co-authored, or edited more than a dozen books on American history, politics, constitutional law, and poetry, including eleven *New York Times* bestsellers. From 2002 through 2011, she served as vice chair of the Fund for Public Schools, an organization dedicated to engaging the private sector in school reform. She is the honorary president of the John F. Kennedy Library Foundation and honorary chair of the Senior Advisory Committee of the Harvard University Institute of Politics.

Kennedy earned a bachelor of arts from Harvard University and a law degree from Columbia University.

THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

Sumanth Chennareddy, from Cumming, Georgia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the College of Arts and Science. He is graduating with a bachelor of arts.

A neuroscience major and Spanish minor, Sumanth received high praise for his depth and breadth of knowledge across several subject areas and his ability to forge partnerships in the Vanderbilt community. On campus, he was a VUceptor, vice president of Vanderbilt's South Asian Cultural Exchange, and a volunteer Spanish language interpreter at the Vanderbilt University School of Medicine student-run Shade Tree Clinic. He received several external awards, including a spot in the Undergraduate Clinical Scholars Program at the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine and the NYU School of Medicine's prestigious Summer Undergraduate Research Program. His research includes investigations of the effects of insulin therapy on colorectal cancer and the impact of federal smoke-free policy on the health of residents in public housing. He has peer-reviewed work forthcoming in the Journal of Community Health. After graduation, Sumanth will attend medical school at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York City.

Matthew James Shorten, from Wollongong, Australia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Blair School of Music. He is graduating with a bachelor of music.

Versatility and a musically collegial spirit complement Australian-born tenor and composer Matthew Shorten's extraordinary musical talents. He has been featured internationally as a soloist, and his compositions have been commissioned by musicians around the world. Matthew has led the campuswide Blair Salon concert series, the Blair Segue orientation program, the Blair Composers Forum, and the Vanderbilt chapters of the American Choral Directors Association and the Music Teachers National Association. He was named a national finalist for the Rhodes Scholarship and received the prestigious Margaret Branscomb Prize, awarded to the first-year student who exemplifies the spirit and standards of the Blair School. As a US Scholar with renowned British choir VOCES8, he toured the United States, studying the art of choral singing, working in educational outreach, and composing a commissioned work for the VOCES8 Scholars that premiered on Minnesota Public Radio. Next year, he will continue performing and composing professionally, before pursuing graduate studies in the fall of 2021.

Luke David Neise, from Wildwood, Missouri, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Engineering. He is graduating with a bachelor of engineering.

Luke's goal is to work on the next generation of challenges in space engineering and space robotics. A double major in mechanical engineering and classical civilizations, Luke credits his experiences at Vanderbilt with developing the knowledge base that will help him reach that goal. As payload lead for the Vanderbilt Aerospace Design Laboratory, Luke experienced

some of the challenges inherent in space engineering and discovered the passions that have inspired his plans for the future. With his fellow lab members, he researched and implemented a drone design for NASA to demonstrate improved planetary sample collection missions. He also helped bring the VADL mission to local schools through outreach presentations and experiments. He was president of the Tau Beta Pi engineering honor society on campus and has been awarded a prestigious National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship. After graduation, he will begin graduate study in the aeronautics and astronautics master's program at Stanford University.

Constance Iris Du, from Vernon Hills, Illinois, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Peabody College and is graduating with a bachelor of science.

During her time at Vanderbilt, Constance dedicated herself to the service of vulnerable populations and the Nashville community. She spent her senior year interning with the Nashville District Attorney's Office, where she worked to provide emergency resources and protection for the city's highest-risk victims. Seeing the law's ability to change lives firsthand cemented her interest in a legal career. Constance also conducted research for pro bono prisoners' rights and asylum cases as a Raja Gaddipati Fellow at DLA Piper and served as a mentor to the Nashville Mayor's Youth Council. On campus, she was a student VUceptor and an officer of the Peabody Council. After graduating with majors in human and organizational development and public policy, Constance will attend the University of Michigan Law School as a Dean's Scholarship recipient and hopes to continue her work in public service for years to come. She is especially grateful to her father, friends, and mentors for their kindness, guidance, and unwavering support.

Michael Fears Johnston, from McDonough, Georgia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Divinity School. He is graduating with a master of divinity.

As an undergraduate, Michael's drive to explore what religions describe as "The Ultimate" inspired him to travel to Egypt where he studied Islam, and his curiosity about interreligious dialogues eventually led him to Vanderbilt Divinity School. During his studies, Michael participated in two programs sponsored by Saint Augustine's Episcopal Chapel and Center for Contemplative Justice, assisting in the Alternative Eucharist for individuals recovering from addictions and in program analysis and development for the congregation's annual medical clinic for the citizens of San Eduardo, Ecuador. Michael received an Imagination Grant to travel to Ecuador to research religious practices of the indigenous Andean Quechua. He was awarded honors for his divinity degree project, and he earned a certificate in Latin American studies in addition to his master's degree. Michael hopes to pursue doctoral studies in anthropology

Joshua Andrew Bruner, from Kansas City, Missouri, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Owen Graduate School of Management and is graduating with a master of business administration.

The life sciences are at the heart of Josh's professional work. He earned a degree in medicinal chemistry at Vanderbilt and has long been interested in the science and financial decisions that make biopharmaceutical companies tick. After working in sales and financial advisory roles, Josh determined that an MBA and a career in health care investment banking were the next steps toward his long-term goals. Josh has excelled at balancing the rigors of a full course load at Owen with helping to care for his son, born during Josh's first semester. Josh was president of the Owen Finance Club, and he describes mentoring and coaching first-year students through their career searches as one of his most meaningful Owen experiences. After graduating, Josh and his wife, Sydney (who earned a Ph.D. in pharmacology at Vanderbilt), and their son, Ash, will move to Richmond, Virginia, where Josh will join Harris Williams as an investment banking associate.

Micah N. Bradley, from Brentwood, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist from the Law School. She is graduating with a doctor of jurisprudence.

Micah earned her undergraduate degree in English from Rollins College. As a law student at Vanderbilt, she was the 2018 recipient of the Archie B. Martin Memorial Prize for Scholarship, awarded "to the student of the first-year law class who has earned the highest general average." Micah was also the 2019 recipient of the Robert F. Jackson Memorial Prize, which is awarded "to the member of the second-year class who has maintained the highest scholastic average during the two years." During Micah's 1L and 2L summers, she worked at Sherrard Roe Voigt & Harbison and Bass Berry & Sims in Nashville. She was senior en banc editor of the *Vanderbilt Law Review* and was on the board of editors of the *Environmental Law and Policy Annual Review*. Micah is interested in litigation and will be clerking for the Honorable Eli Richardson in the Middle District of Tennessee after graduation.

Thea Jean Autry, from Katy, Texas, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Graduate School. She is graduating with a doctor of philosophy in English.

Thea's research and teaching focus on U.S. literature and visual arts of the nineteenth, twentieth, and twenty-first centuries, with emphasis on theories of visuality, race, gender, sexuality, and cultural geography. She has earned numerous grants and scholarships, including a student-directed seminar grant from the Robert Penn Warren Center for the Humanities. She has been recruited as a reviewer by the *European Journal of American Culture*, and her

paper proposals have been accepted at several national and international conferences. In her capacity as an officer in the English Graduate Student Association, she participated in the Tennessee Prison Books Project and college application workshops at Martin Luther King Jr. Academic Magnet School in Nashville. Admired by her students, Thea designed and taught four well-received undergraduate courses. She is finishing a year in residence at Kenyon College after winning a prestigious Yarbrough Dissertation Fellowship and has multiple professional prospects lined up for the fall.

Jane Marie Mericle, from Avondale, Pennsylvania, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Nursing. She is graduating with a doctor of nursing practice.

Jane was already a chief nursing officer with decades of experience when she joined Vanderbilt's doctor of nursing practice program. She wanted to pursue further scholarship herself and to model lifelong learning for the nurses she directs. Her doctoral scholarly project explored strategies to increase professional well-being and decrease stress for frontline nurse managers—a vital group of experienced nurses at high risk for burnout and turnover. Jane's project implemented a LEAN improvement approach to developing strategies to address this issue, one that can be adapted to other health care organizations. Since finishing her degree, Jane has been promoted to an expanded role at Alfred I. duPont Hospital for Children and Nemours Delaware Valley clinical sites. As operational vice president and chief nursing and patient operations officer, she leads strategic initiatives and serves as the senior nurse executive, helping shape the organization's strategy and future. Jane says she is a stronger leader now because her Vanderbilt program presented challenges along with support that enabled her to flourish.

Kianna Roze Jackson, from Evansville, Indiana, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Medicine. She is graduating with a doctor of medicine.

Kianna completed her undergraduate education at MIT before beginning medical training here as a Cornelius Vanderbilt Scholar. At Vanderbilt, she has been a leader and mentor, serving as president of the Student National Medical Association, committee chair for the Student Wellness Program, and leader for the Shade Tree Clinic, Vanderbilt's free student-run clinic for Nashville's underserved. As a medical student, Kianna found a love for plastic surgery and spearheaded the creation of a new plastic surgery elective. Her numerous accolades as a medical student include the Levi Watkins Jr. M.D. Student Award and induction into Alpha Omega Alpha, the national medical honor society. Kianna will be the first doctor in her family (followed by her sister who is now a first-year medical student), and she credits her mother and many mentors for getting her where she is today. REVEREND BEVERLY A. ASBURY AWARD FOR INTERFAITH DIALOGUE. Reverend Beverly A. Asbury was an outstanding person who served Vanderbilt University with honor and distinction for nearly thirty years as chaplain, director of religious affairs, and an adjunct professor at the university's Divinity School. In addition to his involvement in civil rights since his youth, Rev. Asbury brought to Vanderbilt a sense of life, commitment, and tolerance that changed the culture on campus forever. A true humanitarian and bridge builder, Rev. Asbury brought together students, staff, faculty, and the community in conversation when it was needed most. This award is given to an undergraduate student who exhibits the mindset of Rev. Asbury in work towards interfaith dialogue.

RHODES SCHOLARSHIP. The Rhodes Scholarship is the oldest (first awarded in 1902) and perhaps most prestigious international scholarship programme, enabling outstanding young people from around the world to study at the University of Oxford. The program provides opportunities for fellows to define their career interests, gain hands-on experience, and develop new networks within a dynamic professional environment.

SCHWARZMAN SCHOLARSHIP. Established in 2016, inspired by the Rhodes Scholarship, the program supports up to 200 scholars annually from the U.S., China, and around the world for a one-year master's degree program at Tsinghua University in Beijing. They live in Beijing for a year of study and cultural immersion, attending lectures, traveling, and developing a better understanding of China.

SKIP BAYLESS AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN SPORTS JOURNAL-ISM. Presented to an outstanding student who exhibits a tireless work ethic and relentless commitment to truth telling in sports coverage, analysis, and commentary.
