

Yellow-Throated Vireo





The yellow-throated vireo (Vireo flavifrons)

Is commonly found on branches along the edges of deciduous forests, snacking on caterpillars, moths, butterflies, aphids, beetles, dragonflies, cicadas, and berries.

Known as songbirds, males repeatedly sing three eight throughout the day. Atypical to songbirds, males and females build their nest together, take turns incubating the eggs, then

feed the nestlings throughout the day. There are typically four

youngsters, and they leave the nest 14-15 days after hatching. *Photo by Dr. Billy Teets*
