<p>This Maymester will explore how foodways are impacted by global sociopolitical forces, with a particular focus on imperialism and migration. Through an exploration of the history, culture and cuisine of Portugal and its former colonies, students will uncover the multiple paths and interactions of ingredients, ideas and people that impact what is on their plate. Students will spend most of this trip in Lisbon, Portugal's historic capital, which we will use as a base for exploring a variety of locations in the South and Center of Portugal including Sagres, Sintra, Nazaré and Anadia. Toward the end of the month we will travel to Porto, the second largest city, located in the North, and make side trips to Vila Nova de Gaia, Guimarães and Braga.</p>
