

Join us for the **February Watercolor Workshop**, where you'll explore color, technique, and expression while creating your own artwork to take home.





Decatur, Alabama, and in nearby Florence, Alabama, the

Rosenbaum House, designed by Frank Lloyd Wright.

Each January, Wheeler National Wildlife Refuge becomes a stage for one of nature's grand performances: the migration of over 20,000 sandhill cranes. These elegant, long-legged birds arrive from the upper Midwest to spend the winter in the refuge's

wetlands, filling the air with their distinctive calls and graceful movements.

Visitors can observe the cranes—alongside a few rare whooping cranes—from the heated Observation Building.



This will be a day trip, leaving at 7:00 a.m., returning to Nashville by 5 p.m.

Admission to Wheeler is free; Rosenbaum House group admission is \$5.

We will also stop for a tea room lunch in Florence.
