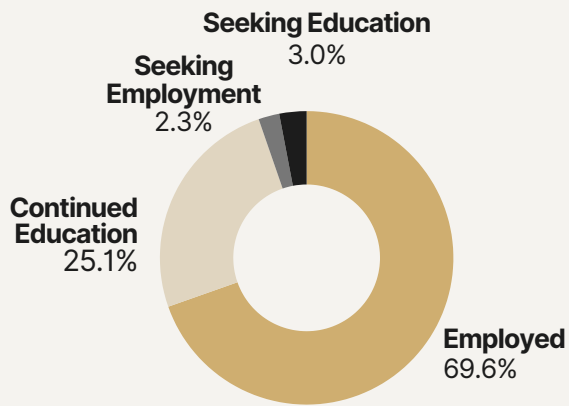

ABOUT THE DATA

This report references the 2023 "First Destination" survey, a standardized tool capturing where students land six months post-graduation. The survey collects data on employment, graduate school enrollment and other metrics, providing a snapshot of initial career and educational achievements. This six-month marker is chosen to reflect a critical transition period, allowing a focused analysis of graduates' immediate post-collegiate experiences while acknowledging the limitation of capturing outcomes only within this timeframe.

**US allopathic/MD medical schools accepted (149) out of (192) Vanderbilt University (VU) first-time applicants for a 78% Acceptance Rate (compared to the National Rate of 46%); Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC). Medical school acceptance rate pertains to the 2023 Entering Cycle, which includes applicants who graduated in 2022 or earlier, as some Vanderbilt pre-med students take a gap year before matriculation.
