THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The processional begins with a trumpet fanfare as the candidates for degrees march onto the field, school by school. Each group is preceded by a banner bearer and led by the dean and the Founder's Medalist for the school. The candidates enter the field from four points.

I

Entering from the northwest side is the **College of Arts and Science**, marching in two columns and led by:

Dean John Geer, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of arts. Their banner has a white field.

II

Entering from the northeast corner are **Blair School of Music**, the **School of Engineering**, the **Next Steps** program, and undergraduates from **Peabody College**. They are led by:

Dean Lorenzo F. Candelaria, Blair School of Music, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of music and bachelor of musical arts. Their banner has a pink field.

Dean Philippe M. Fauchet, School of Engineering, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of engineering and bachelor of science. Their banner has an orange field.

Dean Camilla P. Benbow, Peabody College, followed by participants in the Next Steps program and candidates for the degree of bachelor of science. The Peabody banner has a light blue field.

III

Entering from the southwest corner are the **Law School**, the **School of Medicine**, and the **Graduate School**. They are led by:

Dean Chris Guthrie, Law School, followed by the candidates for the degrees of master of laws and doctor of jurisprudence. Their banner has a purple field.

Dean Jeffrey R. Balser, School of Medicine, followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of audiology, master of education of the deaf, master of science (speech-language pathology), master of science (applied clinical informatics), master of science in clinical investigation, master of science in medical physics, master of genetic counseling, and master of public health. Their banner has a green field.

Dean André Christie-Mizell, Graduate School, followed by the candidates for the degrees of master of arts, master of science, master of fine arts, master of liberal arts and science, master of engineering, and doctor of philosophy. The banner for the doctor of philosophy has a dark blue field.

IV

Entering from the southeast are the **Divinity School**, **Owen Graduate School of Management**, the post-baccalaureate graduates of **Peabody College**, and the **School of Nursing**. They are led by:

Dean Emilie M. Townes, Divinity School, followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of ministry, master of divinity, master of theological studies, and master of theology. Their banner has a scarlet field.

Dean M. Eric Johnson, Owen Graduate School of Management, followed by the candidates for the degrees of master of business administration, master of accountancy, master of science in finance, master of marketing, and master of management in health care. Their banner has a light brown field.

Student Sophia Meyer, Peabody College, followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of education, master of education, and master of public policy. Their banner has a light blue field.

Dean Pamela R. Jeffries, School of Nursing, followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of nursing practice and master of science in nursing. Their banner has an apricot field.

V

After the candidates are seated, trumpets will sound a second fanfare and the next procession will enter from the south, led by:

Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs and Professional Education Tracey George, followed by the professors emeriti and the faculty.

VI

After the faculty have entered, a third trumpet fanfare will sound, and the final procession will enter. The order is:

The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak laurels are a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity and were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The initial gold “V” takes center prominence, signifying what is rare and lasting, its beveled appearance simulating the permanence of stone carving. The rays of the North Star and notches around the edge evoke the nautical compass, a reminder of Commodore Cornelius Vanderbilt’s background, but also a symbol of the mission of the university as a community that helps to guide lifelong potential through self-direction. Vanderbilt’s motto in the encircling banner is *Crescere aude*, Latin for “dare to grow.” It embodies the sentiment expressed in Vanderbilt’s alma mater, “Forward! ever be thy watchword.”

The current chair of the Faculty Senate, or the vice chair if the chair is unavailable, carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university’s authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The chancellor’s insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder’s Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. The decagonal silver frame of the medallion symbolizes the ten schools. Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping and gold velvet bars on the sleeves and the university seal on the chest panel of the gowns.

The design of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor’s degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black. The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—bell-shaped sleeve with three velvet bars. Vanderbilt’s custom gown for those receiving the doctor of philosophy has antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered “V” on the gown’s yoke. Vanderbilt doctoral candidates wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D., D.N.P., D.Min., or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, apricot for nursing, scarlet for ministry, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines. Masters’ hoods are edged with white for arts, brown for fine arts, gold for science, purple for law, salmon pink for public

health, peacock blue for public policy, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

The Banner Bearers

Each banner, with a field in the appropriate academic color, is decorated with the Vanderbilt logo. In recognition of Peabody’s history, a Peabody Centennial Medal in a round walnut frame is mounted above the banner. Banner bearers are:

THE Nichols- Chancellor's MEDAL

The Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is one of the university's highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols. The medal is presented at Vanderbilt University Graduates Day.

The 2023 Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is presented to Maria Ressa, a Nobel laureate and internationally acclaimed journalist who has endured political threats and government arrests for her commitment to truth and democracy.

Born in the Philippines, Ressa grew up in New Jersey and graduated cum laude from Princeton University with a bachelor of arts in English. She returned to Manila in 1986 on a Fulbright fellowship and in 1987 began reporting for CNN, eventually running the CNN bureaus in Manila and Jakarta. She currently is CEO of Rappler, a digital media company she co-founded in 2012 whose investigative journalism is leading the fight for freedom of the press in the Philippines and beyond.

Ressa received the Nobel Peace Prize in 2021 for her efforts to safeguard freedom of expression while being persecuted by the administration of Philippine president Rodrigo Duterte. She was among the group of journalists named *Time* magazine's "Person of the Year" in 2018 for their efforts to protect the free press despite violent attacks and criminal charges. Her many honors include the UNESCO/Guillermo Cano World Press Freedom Prize, the National Press Club's John Aubuchon Press Freedom Award, and the Golden Pen of Freedom Award from the World Association of Newspapers and News Publishers.

THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

Estelle Carole Shaya, from Wooster, Ohio, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the College of Arts and Science. She is graduating with a bachelor of arts.

Estelle majored in Earth and environmental sciences and Latin American studies. The summer after her junior year she volunteered with the Andean Information Network, a human rights group in Bolivia, an experience supported by the Simon-Collier Grant from the Vanderbilt Center for Latin American, Caribbean, and Latinx Studies. She helped advocate for victims of the 2019 post-election violence in the region by translating the Independent Interdisciplinary Group Report on this violence and reports from the Andean Information Network on torture. Her translations helped the nonprofit group spread information and combat misinformation. At Vanderbilt she was editor-in-chief of Vanderbilt's satirical magazine *The Slant* and a member of the College Scholars Council and the Vanderbilt Association for Women Geoscientists. After graduation, she will go to Brazil on a Fulbright English Teaching Assistant award. She hopes to attend law school in the next five years to advance her goal of advocating for victims of sexual and gender-based violence.

Jack Edward Allen, from Nashville, Tennessee, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Blair School of Music. He is graduating with a bachelor of music.

Before attending Vanderbilt, Jack participated in the Blair Academy precollegiate program. His work with his Blair professors during high school sparked his desire to pursue a music career. While completing a major in piano performance and minors in saxophone and German studies, Jack was president of the Vanderbilt Piano Society and vice president of Nightingales in the Wings, a performance-based volunteer organization that provides music to hospitals and senior living facilities. He also supported Blair first-year students as a Blair Segue mentor. He was a volunteer teacher at the W. O. Smith Music School, which strengthened his resolve to eventually teach piano at the college level. He finds joy in teaching skills for expression and connection, skills that were particularly meaningful for him as he dealt with the death of his father in December 2021 after a yearlong battle with cancer. After graduation, Jack will pursue his master of music in piano performance at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music.

Patrick Kanan Darmawi-Iskandar, from San Francisco, California, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Engineering. He is graduating with a bachelor of engineering.

Patrick studied electrical and computer engineering and was a SyBBURE Searle research fellow at the Institute for Space and Defense Electronics, where he examined the effects of radiation on carbon nanotube field-effect transistors. His hands-on experience with cutting-edge electronics and his participation in the inclusive, passionate and tightknit SyBBURE research community encouraged Patrick to consider pursuing a doctorate. At Vanderbilt he was president of the Amateur Radio Club and helped organize numerous STEM outreach events, including connecting children at

Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt with astronauts on the International Space Station by radio. After spending the summer as an associate engineer at SpaceX, he plans to pursue his Ph.D. in electrical engineering and computer science at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology as a Department of Defense National Defense Science and Engineering Graduate Fellow. Patrick's parents are first-generation immigrants, and he plans to work hard to make them proud and take advantage of all the opportunities they made possible.

Sara Elizabeth Johanson, from Greenville, South Carolina, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Peabody College. She is graduating with a bachelor of science.

Sara combined her interests in travel, learning, and service while completing her studies in early childhood and elementary education and international education policy. In the summer of 2022, she taught English at a nonprofit school in Athens, Greece, working with refugee teenagers without English experience through the Peabody Scholars program. She learned to hone her teaching skills and discovered a passion for working with emergent bilingual students. Sara was a Cornelius Vanderbilt Scholar, a Peabody Scholar, and the Kappa Delta Pi international education honor society president. She also was a three-time VUceptor, mentoring more than 70 first-year students. For her work in the community, Sara won the Peabody Diversity and Inclusion grant in collaboration with Nashville Book Connection, a program that nurtures elementary students' reading of culturally responsive books. After graduation, she will teach kindergarten at Nashville's Glenview Elementary School with a class of mostly emergent bilinguals and will finish the last semester of her master's program in international education policy and management.

Lauren Danielle Garrett, from Richmond, Virginia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Divinity School. She is graduating with a master of divinity.

Danielle earned her bachelor of arts at William & Mary and her master of public affairs at the University of Texas at Austin. At Vanderbilt she studied ministry, with a concentration in pastoral and prophetic congregational leadership. Through her field education placement at the First Unitarian Universalist Church of Nashville, she developed a deeper understanding of ministry beyond the pulpit, focusing on church membership and religious education. Courses in ethics and the sociology of religion were especially important for her intellectual and vocational formation, and she earned honors for her master's project, "Contemporary Pilgrimage and the Sacralization of the Self: Walking the Way of St. James in a Neoliberal World." She was a Carpenter Fellow, helping to run the Queer Faith and Policy Learning Cohort, and vice president of the Divinity School's student government association. Danielle will be moving to Portland, Oregon, to begin a congregational internship at the First Unitarian Church of Portland. When she is not preparing for ordination, she enjoys reading, hiking, planning pilgrimage trips, and spending time with her wife, Mari, and dog, Jo March.

Now a double 'Dore, Ashley earned her bachelor of science in child development at Vanderbilt in 2017. Before attending Owen, she was a nurse at Vanderbilt's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, which was a formative experience for her career. The concentrations for her MBA studies at Owen were health care and operations & analytics. While at Owen, she completed an independent study with a local health care startup, which inspired her to approach strategic health care problems from a new perspective. On campus, she helped educate and mentor business students interested in health care as president of the Vanderbilt Business Healthcare Association. One of the highlights of her Owen career was her work with Nashville's Sexual Assault Center via the Owen Board Fellows program, which allows Vanderbilt MBA students to serve as nonvoting board members at nonprofits for a year. After graduation, she will continue as a board member with the center, and in the fall she will join the Nashville office of Boston Consulting Group.

Mary Alexandra Dennard Teague, from Charlotte, North Carolina, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Law School. She is graduating with a doctor of jurisprudence.

She has already contributed significantly to our understanding of the role of the endogenous cannabinoid system in regulating fear and anxiety behavior. She was awarded a Ruth L. Kirchstein Predoctoral Individual National Research Service Award from the National Institutes of Health. And in a field in which graduate students average two to three publications, Veronika will have more than

twenty publications from her time at Vanderbilt. Her integration of high scientific achievement with compassion and hard work gives her the potential to make a great impact as a scientist and a leader. After graduation, Veronika will begin a postdoctoral fellowship at Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York City.

Her doctoral project focusing on care for children undergoing tracheostomy will ultimately enhance the care of these vulnerable patients. Jill also is committed to removing barriers to health care access. Her drive to change our health care delivery systems to better serve all our citizens led to her work with the Tennessee Nurses Association and efforts to shape public policy through advocacy.
