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THE ACADEMIC PROCESSION

The undergraduate processional begins with a trumpet fanfare as the candidates for degrees march onto the field, school by school. Each group is preceded by a banner bearer and led by the dean and the Founder's Medalist for the school. The candidates enter the field from two points.

PROCESSIONAL I

Entering from the northwest corner of the field is the **College of Arts and Science**, marching in two columns and led by:

Dean Timothy P. McNamara, followed by candidates for the degree of bachelor of arts and bachelor of science. Their banner has a white field.

Founding Dean Matthew Johnson-Roberson, College of Connected Computing. The College of Connected Computing has no candidates for graduation in 2026.

Entering from the northeast corner are **Blair School of Music**, the **School of Engineering**, the **Next Steps** program, and **Peabody College**. They are led by:

Dean Melissa Rose, Blair School of Music, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of music and bachelor of musical arts. Their banner has a pink field.

Dean Krishnendu Roy, School of Engineering, followed by candidates for the degrees of bachelor of engineering and bachelor of science. Their banner has an orange field.

Dean Camilla Benbow, Peabody College, followed by participants in the Next Steps program and candidates for the degree of bachelor of science. Their banner has a light blue field.

PROCESSIONAL II

After the candidates are seated, trumpets will sound a second fanfare and the next procession will enter from the south, led by:

Vice Provost for Faculty Affairs and Professional Education Duane Watson, followed by the professors emeriti and the faculty.

After the faculty have entered, a third trumpet fanfare will sound, and the final procession will enter. The order is:

The graduate and professional degree recipients of the Divinity School, the Graduate School, the Law School, the School of Medicine, the School of Nursing, Owen Graduate School of Management, and Peabody College will celebrate their Commencement in separate ceremonies.

Law School

Dean Chris Guthrie, Law School, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of master of laws and doctor of jurisprudence. Their banner has a purple field.

School of Medicine

Dean Jeffrey R. Balser, School of Medicine, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of medicine, doctor of audiology, doctor of medical physics, master of education of the deaf, master of science (speech-language pathology), master of science (applied clinical informatics), master of science in clinical investigation, master of science in medical physics, master of genetic counseling, and master of public health. Their banner has a green field.

Graduate School

Dean André Christie-Mizell, Graduate School, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of master of arts, master of science, master of fine arts, master of liberal arts and science, master of engineering, and doctor of philosophy. The banner for the doctor of philosophy has a dark blue field. The banner for the master of engineering has an orange field.

Divinity School

Dean Yolanda Pierce, Divinity School, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of ministry, master of divinity, master of theological studies, and master of theology. Their banner has a scarlet field.

Owen Graduate School of Management

Dean Thomas J. Steenburgh, Owen Graduate School of Management, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of master of business administration, master of accountancy, master of science in finance, master of marketing, and master of management in health care. Their banner has a light brown field.

Peabody College (Post-Baccalaureate Graduates)

Dean Camilla Benbow, Peabody College, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of education, master of education, and master of public policy. Their banner has a light blue field.

School of Nursing

Dean Pamela R. Jeffries, School of Nursing, is followed by the candidates for the degrees of doctor of nursing practice, master of nursing, and master of science in nursing. Their banner has an apricot field.

The Symbols and Regalia

The visual symbols of Vanderbilt University communicate our rich history and our vibrant future. The oak laurels are a traditional symbol for education as well as for strength and longevity and were inspired by motifs from the Vanderbilt family coat of arms. The initial gold “V” takes center prominence, signifying what is rare and lasting, its beveled appearance simulating the permanence of stone carving. The rays of the North Star and notches around the edge evoke the nautical compass, a reminder of Commodore Cornelius Vanderbilt’s background, but also a symbol of the mission of the university as a community that helps to guide lifelong potential through self-direction. Vanderbilt’s motto in the encircling banner is *Crescere aude*, Latin for “dare to grow.” It embodies the sentiment expressed in Vanderbilt’s alma mater, “Forward! ever be thy watchword.”

The current chair of the Faculty Senate, or the vice chair if the chair is unavailable, carries the mace, an ancient sign of authority. It is displayed on the front of the podium as the symbol of the university’s authority to confer degrees. Symbolic images that decorate the gilded metal of the mace include VU monograms, embattled shields, oak leaves and acorns, irises and magnolias.

The chancellor’s insignia of office is a silver and gilt collar that displays several emblems of the university. The parallel chains of sterling silver are surmounted by alternating Vanderbilt shields and modified Founder’s Medals, from which hangs a medallion with an impression of the seal of the university. Trustees of the university wear black gowns distinguished by gold piping and gold velvet bars on the sleeves and the university seal on the chest panel of the gowns.

The design of the academic regalia and the colors worn are significant. Undergraduates—those receiving bachelor’s degrees—wear tassels signifying the degree they have earned: golden yellow for science, pink for music, and orange for engineering. By tradition, the bachelor of arts degree tassels are black. The distinguishing mark of the gown is the sleeve: bachelor—a long, pointed sleeve; master—an oblong sleeve open at the wrist; doctor—bell-shaped sleeve with three velvet bars. Vanderbilt candidates for the doctor of philosophy wear eight-sided velvet tams with gold tassels and a custom gown with antique gold front and back panels and an embroidered “V” on the front. Candidates for a doctoral degree other than the doctor of philosophy wear black gowns and six-sided tams.

The velvet edging of the doctoral hoods signifies whether the degree is J.D., M.D., Ed.D., D.N.P., D.Min., or Ph.D.—purple for law, green for medicine, light blue for education, apricot for nursing, scarlet for ministry, and dark blue for the doctor of philosophy, which may be earned in a number of disciplines. Masters’ hoods are edged with white for arts, brown for fine arts, gold for science, purple for law, salmon pink for public

health, peacock blue for public policy, scarlet for theology, light blue for education, orange for engineering, apricot for nursing, and light brown for business. All hoods are lined with silk in colors signifying the institution granting the degree. Vanderbilt hoods are lined in gold and bear a black chevron.

THE Nichols- Chancellor's MEDAL

The Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is one of the university's highest honors and is awarded to individuals who define the 21st century and exemplify the best qualities of the human spirit. It was established by Vanderbilt Law School graduate Edward C. Nichols, Jr., and his wife, Janice, in memory of Edward Carmack Nichols and Lucile Hamby Nichols. The medal is presented at Vanderbilt University Graduates Day.

The 2026 Nichols-Chancellor's Medal is presented to Arthur C. Brooks—award-winning author, professor, and distinguished scholar whose work explores the intersections of happiness, balance, curiosity, and excellence. His research draws on science and philosophy to examine how individuals and communities cultivate meaningful and fulfilling lives.

Brooks is an international speaker on human well-being and has worked with private companies, universities, public agencies, and community organizations to advance understanding of happiness and flourishing. He is also a scholar of philanthropy and the author of *Who Really Cares*, as well as several widely read books on purpose and meaning, including the *New York Times* bestseller *From Strength to Strength* and his most recent work, *The Meaning of Your Life: Finding Purpose in an Age of Emptiness*.

He previously served as president of the American Enterprise Institute, a Washington, D.C.–based public policy research organization, and has contributed to national media as a commentator, columnist, and podcast host. After holding faculty appointments at Harvard University since 2019, Brooks will join Vanderbilt University as an endowed professor in the Department of Medicine, Health, and Society in the College of Arts and Science beginning July 1.

THE FOUNDER'S MEDAL RECIPIENTS

Zhihe Zhang, from Shanghai, China, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the College of Arts and Science. She is graduating with a bachelor of arts.

Zhihe majored in classical and Mediterranean studies with minors in history of art and architecture and museum studies. A recipient of the Crescere Aude Scholarship, her honors include the Mary Eleanor Steele Scholarship for outstanding female students in her major and the Hans-Joachim Schulz Award for undergraduate research in Germany. Her thesis examines Thucydides' Sicilian Expedition from a tragic perspective.

Her academic path has been shaped by international archaeological digs under the guidance of Professor Joseph Rife and other faculty. During a Maymester in the ruins of Caesarea, an ancient port city on the north coast of Israel, she excavated a medieval wall structure.

In Corinth, Greece, she digitally illustrated and catalogued more than a hundred bronze artifacts for open-access dissemination through the Kenchreai Archaeological Archive. In Cosa, Italy, she excavated a Roman bath complex. On campus, she participated in a dig on the grounds of the 1870s home of William J. Vaughn.

Zhihe was a Buchanan Library Fellow in spring 2025, helping research and curate the exhibit *Book as Art: Preserving Cultural Heritage and Knowledge*. Her area of focus was East Asian pouch binding.

Zhihe is grateful to Professors Rife, Daniel Solomon, Chiara Sulprizio, James Zainaldin, and other dedicated faculty members in the Department of Classical and Mediterranean Studies. After graduation, she will pursue a Ph.D. in classical studies at the University of California, Berkeley. She aspires to conduct comparative research between classical East Asia and the Mediterranean world.

Catherine Louise Brenmark, from Plainfield, Illinois, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Blair School of Music. She is graduating with a bachelor of music.

A Cornelius Vanderbilt Scholar majoring in bassoon performance with a minor in psychology, Catie has been recognized with honors including the Elliot and Ailsa Newman Prize for excellence in woodwind performance. She also was a finalist in the Meg Quigley Vivaldi Competition for students across the Americas and was awarded Blair's Dave Darlington Award for Outstanding Creative Work in Music Technology.

Catie's academic experiences have shaped her artistic identity and goals, especially her love for musical collaborations with her peers and others across the Vanderbilt community. She is grateful to Professor Peter Kolkay for his profound impact on her development as a musician and person.

Her school service included organizing orientation activities for first-year students and serving as head orchestra librarian for the Vanderbilt University Orchestra. At Vanderbilt MusicTech Camp, Catie saw the power of mentorship while guiding middle and high school students through creative and technical challenges to compose original video game soundtracks.

Outside of Vanderbilt, Catie is a Nashville session musician, recording music for television, film, and video game soundtracks. She plans to pursue a master of music at the Yale School of Music and build a career that includes chamber music, orchestral performance, teaching, and collaboration across a range of musical settings.

Yiming Chen, from Nanjing, China, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Engineering. He is graduating with a bachelor of engineering.

Yiming, a Crescere Aude Scholar, earned highest honors in chemistry and honors in chemical engineering. He received the Karl B. Schnelle Jr. Award for Outstanding Performance in Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering, is a member of Tau Beta Pi, and made the Dean's List every semester.

His research experiences have shaped his interest in using both theory and experiment to explore nanomaterials and their applications in catalysis and energy. His sophomore year, he joined Professor De-en Jiang's lab and was introduced to computational chemistry and atomic-scale insight into catalytic processes. He also conducted research related to phase control of colloidal nanomaterials under the supervision of Professor Janet Macdonald.

Yiming participated in the VUSE Summer Research Program and the Vanderbilt Undergraduate Summer Research Program during his second and third summers. These opportunities and resources provided by Vanderbilt enabled him to conduct independent research and collaborate with scientists from Oak Ridge National Laboratory, Yale University and the University of California, Riverside.

His research accomplishments include one first-author publication, three collaborative publications, and one invention disclosure.

Outside of his studies, Yiming has a keen interest in table tennis and was selected for the Vanderbilt Table Tennis Club travel team.

After graduation, he will pursue doctoral study at the University of California, Berkeley and continue working at the intersection of nanomaterials, energy and catalysis.

Emma Catherine Mann, from New Palestine, Indiana, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Peabody College. She is graduating with a bachelor of science.

Emma, the daughter of an educator, majored in human and organizational development and minored in psychology. Her career path has been shaped by her passion to ensure every child can experience the fullness of joy in childhood. A serious heart condition that forced her to give up running and discover new interests ultimately led her to transfer to Vanderbilt in 2023.

She refuses to be defined by her diagnosis or two heart procedures. Instead, Emma has developed a deeper understanding of resilience—one that shapes her efforts to expand mental health support and resources for children and families, including through her work at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt and The Covenant School.

She is grateful for the Cameron Impact Scholarship, which made her Vanderbilt education possible, and the Joel Gordon Scholarship, which supports HOD students completing their capstone project with a Nashville-based health care organization. With the encouragement of Principal Senior Lecturer Jeremy Payne, she applied for the HOD Honors Program and developed foundational research skills leading to transformative discoveries. She is also grateful to Professor and Vice Dean Nicole Allen for her mentorship.

As part of the Vanderbilt Undergraduate Summer Research Program, Emma worked with Shari Neul at the Children's Hospital in pre- and post-stem cell transplant psychosocial functioning. Assistant Provost Jill Stratton and Associate Professor of the Practice Leigh Gilchrist also helped guide her journey. Most important, she thanks God and her family.

After graduation, Emma will pursue a doctorate in clinical psychology at the University of Kentucky, with the goal of bridging academic medicine with a commitment to serve rural communities.

Isabel Billings Draper, of Atlanta, Georgia, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Divinity School. They are graduating with a master of divinity.

Isabel earned a bachelor of arts from Barnard College, majoring in English with a concentration in creative writing. At Vanderbilt, their focus has been ministry and theological thought in the field of prison and carceral studies.

A course at the Tennessee Prison for Women on theodicy—the question of how God can exist when there is evil in the world—helped shape Isabel's career path. A theology class on the resurrection of Jesus further developed their understanding of how academic theology can be applied in pastoral and ecclesial settings.

Their field education was at Dismas House in Nashville, a nonprofit organization that helps men coming out of prison reenter and reintegrate into society. Isabel provided spiritual care to a man at Dismas who had been incarcerated since he was 15 years old. Helping him navigate the faith challenges of entering society for the first time as an adult man in his 40s shaped the way Isabel thinks theologically about sin, harm, rehabilitation and the forgiveness and grace of God.

Isabel loved serving in pastoral ministries at Christ Church Cathedral in Nashville—including the healing prayer ministry and the distribution of the Eucharist—and will pursue ordination in the Episcopal Church, with hopes of serving in congregational ministry with a focus on pastoral care.

Brian Henry Kube, from Randolph, New Jersey, is this year's Founder's Medalist for Owen Graduate School of Management. He is graduating with a master of business administration.

Brian earned a bachelor of arts in economics from Vassar College, where he played varsity lacrosse. At Vanderbilt, he was a Bruce D. Henderson Scholar. His MBA concentrations were strategy, marketing, and brand management.

Classes that had the greatest influence on him were Corporate Strategy, taught by Brian McCann, and Supply Chain Management, taught by Yasin Alan. He is grateful for “world-class marketing education” provided by Steve Posavac, Eric VanEpps, and Steve Hoeffler.

He traces his long-standing interest in consumer goods and brand marketing to his childhood, when his grandfather worked for Pepperidge Farm. Brian grew up eating Goldfish, Chessmen and Milanos that had been pulled from shelves due

to minor manufacturing defects. He learned how much joy technically “flawed” products can bring to consumers. Years later, Brian pursued an MBA to build brands that can bring joy in both good and bad times.

He served as a teaching assistant for Management Communications and Marketing Strategy and as vice president of alumni relations for the Owen Marketing Association. One of his meaningful service experiences was helping the Vanderbilt Next Steps program conduct mock job interviews with their neurodiverse students, whose dedication, passion and enthusiasm he admires.

Brian is grateful to career coach Zeke Arteaga and his girlfriend, Brooke, for their encouragement; and to his parents, Marc and Barbara; his twin brother, Eric; and his friends and Vanderbilt professors for their support. After graduation, Brian plans to work in brand management and parlay that experience into his own better-for-you consumer packaged goods company.

Nicholas Wallenburg, from Lenexa, Kansas, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Law School. He is graduating with a doctor of jurisprudence.

Nick, who earned a bachelor of science from the University of Nebraska–Lincoln, will be the first attorney in his family. He won the Archie B. Martin Memorial Prize for Scholarship and scholastic excellence awards for highest grade in Torts, Contracts, Regulatory State, Evidence I, Evidence II, Administrative Law, Constitutional Law II, Federal Indian Law, and Corporations.

His career path was profoundly shaped by the Vanderbilt Legal Academy Scholars Program. After many years of competitive debate, he initially planned to become a litigator. However, through the Legal Academy Scholars Program, he worked as a research and teaching assistant for law professors who provided strong mentorship. This experience inspired him to consider an academic career.

Nick was editor-in-chief of *Vanderbilt Law Review* and an articles editor of *Environmental Law and Policy Annual Review*.

He was a member of the national moot court team and national mock trial team. He also was a co-winner of the law school's intramural moot court competition, receiving the best brief award. Later he enjoyed volunteering as a judge, noting that he learned as much being a judge as he did competing.

After graduation, Nick will clerk first for Senior Judge Daniel D. Crabtree on the U.S. District Court for the District of Kansas, then Judge W. Duane Benton on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 8th Circuit. In the future, he hopes to reenter the academy, researching legal decision-making processes and educating the next generation of law students.

Ryan Anthony Kowalski, from Taunton, Massachusetts, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the Graduate School. He is graduating with a doctor of philosophy in interdisciplinary materials science.

Ryan's research has advanced our understanding of light–matter interactions in the far-infrared region of the electromagnetic spectrum, while opening new pathways for quantum and nanophotonic technologies. His work illustrates how interdisciplinary training can empower students to bridge fields and create entirely new directions in research.

As a member of the Caldwell Lab, Ryan led two ambitious and technically challenging research areas. First, he investigated the vibrational properties of defects in single-photon emitters—crucial for quantum technologies—through his development and application of nano-optic probe techniques. Second, he extended these approaches to the far-infrared spectral region, enabling direct measurement of optical confinement at unprecedented length scales. He also received a NASA Space Technology Graduate Research Opportunities award.

In addition to his research, Ryan provided strong student leadership for the Vanderbilt Institute of Nanoscale Science and Engineering and the Interdisciplinary Materials Science program. As president of the Engineering Ambassadors Network for five years, he taught six engineering disciplines to more than a hundred seventh graders. He mentored prospective students, took part in outreach to underserved communities and organized events, enhancing the collaborative and supportive culture of his research group.

After completing his doctorate in fall 2025, Ryan accepted a postdoctoral position at the University of Maryland Laboratory for Physical Sciences and will continue to develop quantum light sources for applications in computing and secure communications—extending the impact of his Vanderbilt training.

Robert J. Midkiff, from Jacksonville, Florida, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Nursing. He is graduating with a master of science in nursing.

Robert earned bachelor's degrees in nursing and psychology from Marshall University. The loss of his father, who died after living with heart failure and undergoing open-heart surgery, inspired his path in nursing. His father's experience unfolded in rural West Virginia, where access to advanced cardiac care and specialized technology was limited.

Graduate training, including a specialization in nursing informatics, has shaped Robert's career path as a nurse scientist and systems leader. He credits Vanderbilt's emphasis on evidence-based practice and innovation with helping him develop ShieldFlow, an AI-enabled life-support machine featuring a monitoring and decision-support platform. The system aims to standardize care and reduce complications for patients needing high-level life support. ShieldFlow received an innovation award from the Mayo Clinic in Florida.

Robert's professional goal is to bridge the gap between advanced critical care and underserved or rural communities through scalable, data-driven, ethically integrated solutions.

One of his meaningful academic experiences involved caring for a patient who remained on life support for more than 175 days. He formed a deep professional bond with the patient and family, and he will never forget that behind every data point and setting adjustment is a person, a family and a story that deserves care grounded in excellence and empathy.

After finishing his master's last August, Robert enrolled in Vanderbilt's doctor of nursing practice program, focusing on advanced systems leadership and innovation. He mentors new ICU nurses and life support specialists, while continuing his clinical practice at the Mayo Clinic Comprehensive Cancer Center.

Caroline Hope Castleman, from Devon, Pennsylvania, is this year's Founder's Medalist for the School of Medicine. She is graduating with a doctor of medicine.

Caroline earned a bachelor of arts in history from Princeton University. At Vanderbilt, she developed a strong interest in addressing the psychiatric needs of children and families. She served as co-student director of the Shade Tree Clinic's adolescent psychiatry and pediatrics clinics and was inspired by the resilience of patients and their families. Beyond the clinics' regular free patient care for youngsters ages 10 to 18, she and her co-leader added PTSD and suicide screens to their intake paperwork and implemented vision screenings.

Her academic experience in inpatient psychiatry was especially meaningful, and she is grateful for the trust and support of Dr. Callie McCool and Dr. Abhinav Mishra. She took responsibility for one-on-one psychotherapy exercises with each patient, using activities such as drawing and journaling. Caroline discovered how much she values connecting with young people who are experiencing mental health crises and the opportunity to understand how they see the world.

Caroline was awarded the R. Daniel Beauchamp Award from the Department of Psychiatry. She also served as co-president of the Gold Humanism Honor Society, co-president and co-founder of the Society for the History of Medicine, and co-chair of education and research for Pride in Medicine.

In July, Caroline will enter psychiatry residency training at Yale School of Medicine and plans to pursue a fellowship in child psychiatry.
